Reflection from Fr. Hilary: Authority: Seeking the Right Kind (1)

This is the first of three pieces.

The very idea of Authority can have a heated, churned-up effect on many. They regard it as a dirty word but it is sparklingly clean in fact. There has to be Authority in all areas of human life – such as in political and business life, in all institutions, in family, in social life, in the Church. Unfortunately, Authority is seen by many as authoritarianism. The latter word is usually used to refer to people throwing their weight about or bossing others. True Authority, however, is quite different. It never bosses anyone. It will often need to command but that's not bossing. Christ gives the best insights into Authority There was no question of his outstanding Authority. Yet, at the same time, he strongly proclaims that he is the great Servant of God the Father and the Servant of people. "I am among you as one who serves." Now, I shouldn't have used that word "yet". Why? Because it implies that the Lord exercises his outstanding authority and then lays it aside in order to be a Servant. No, no – he is exercising that authority precisely by being a Servant! Please stop and get that right. The world is in a mess because it doesn't exercise this type of authority. What are the things that demonstrate this serving authority of his? Answer: Truth and Love, based on the solid foundation of true humility.

First, his Truth At the end of his Sermon on the Mount we read: "Jesus had now finished what he had to say and his words made a deep impression on the people because he taught them with authority and not like their scribes." This means that the Truth of his message simply rings true – rings true for the deepest needs of every human being in the ongoing task of reaching full development as a person. He spoke with authority – not with ego-centred authoritarianism, and he spoke forcefully, repeating often "but I say this to you."

Secondly, his Love He lived and died out of unique Love for the Truth he preached. By this Love he demonstrated in action what the whole of human living is profoundly about, namely, dealing with people in the most dedicated way. **There on Calvary was the Servant with powerful authority exercised with such eloquent Love.** This means that for true authority to be exercised by anybody there must be the destruction of every arrogant EGO to be replaced by Christlike humility.
