Reflection from Fr. Hilary: Faith 1: Faith and Reason

This is the first of 6 pieces on Faith. Please keep them all. I hope you find this helpful for yourself and in talking to others about matters of Faith. Faith and reason are different, yes, but they are not in opposition. They are complementary. Why shouldn't they be since both come from God? Away, then, with the idea that Reason cancels out Faith or makes nonsense of it. Our Reason is a wonderful faculty and so should be treated with respect. That respect however, won't be slow to admit the limitations of Reason. Reason needs to welcome Faith but Faith too needs to welcome Reason because if you stick to an **irrational** Faith you will find you can't integrate Faith into life. Also, it's unlikely people out there will listen.

Some worry that the truths which science is continually unfolding so rapidly might make us shaky in our faith and diminish people's respect for Faith. This shows a complete misunderstanding. Faith seeks understanding of Truth. So does Reason. Truth cannot contradict truth. But each has its own way of probing Truth. Reason seeks to speculate on life, what it is about, does it have meaning or is it meaningless, is death the end. Vital matters. But Reason can give only very inadequate answers. Faith, however, does offer adequate answers – well, adequate for our needs this side of the grave. Only in the hereafter can we expect fully satisfying answers. The expression 'unaided Reason' is helpful. Unaided Reason needs very much the insights of Faith.

Some people you talk to will speak of Faith being blind and therefore unreasonable. They are wrong. The truths of Faith are given by Christ – truths of Revelation. Reason cannot discover them. Christ and his Church are one. The Church is that unique Community he founded to promote these precious truths. We believe and accept on his Word. So, though faith has a darkness it is also, paradoxically, a powerful light! It is not, then, blind in the sense of believing any old thing irrespective of whether there are good grounds for doing so. Faith, therefore, is reasonable.

We accept lots of matters in ordinary life on faith of some sort. How much more, then, should one accept Christ's Word! He came not to destroy the truth already there but to fulfil. He proclaimed himself as THE TRUTH. Faith isn't meant to be a set of detached propositions to be kept tucked away from the real world. No, it is meant to give reality, true reality, to the so-called real world! Get that straight. It casts light on the whole of human existence and leads to God. Faith illuminates our Reason and inflames our heart with powerful love. Fabulous.

Please keep for prayerful reflection.

Through his prayer, the *Canticle of the Sun*, he presents all creation as a manifestation of the goodness of God — a sacramental expression of God's generous love. Saint Francis was known for his dedication to the poor, peace and interreligious dialogue and we can follow his lead and unite our voices in support of vulnerable communities impacted by climate change.
