Reflection from Father Hilary. Faith 3: Borrow My Faith for A While

This is a lovely story by an anonymous writer:

I'd always been fairly happy in my faith until one morning in Spring about six years ago. I woke up that day to find that everything that had spoken to me of God – the sunrise, my garden, the vista of green fields I could see from my window, the birds singing and the sound of the breeze in the trees – has suddenly become totally meaningless. It was as if there was no God, as if all the beauty in the world had occurred by pure chance, and would vanish forever.

And it got worse. The book I was reading on Therese of Lisieux which had been so fascinating when I began it, became dry, boring and tedious in the extreme. After a couple of weeks, Mass, which had been the highlight of my week, was just another chore, and as for prayer, well I just stopped doing it. This went on for some time until I felt I just couldn't cope with the feeling of emptiness any longer. I decided to go and see a friend of mine, a monk who had helped me through a couple of difficult times in the past.

He received me warmly, and ushered me into a very pleasant parlour where, over a cup of tea, I attempted to explain the problem. He folded his hands, looked up at the ceiling, and after a moment said, "Ah I think I understand. You've come to tell me I'm deluded." I objected quickly that was not at all why I had come, but he went on: "If, as you say, God doesn't exist, then you must believe I'm deluded, sitting here in this medieval habit, having consecrated my whole life to serving him." Well, I could see the logic of the argument, but I was looking at one of the wisest and sanest men I'd ever known, and couldn't bring myself to call him deluded. I told him so. "So, you believe that I believe?" he asked; and when I agreed he went on, "well, that will do for now. Pray to the God I believe in. Borrow my faith for a while, and I think you'll find your own will come back quite soon." It did, and I'd almost forgotten the incident when a couple of years later, an agnostic friend turned up on my doorstep in a very agitated state. "I've done something absolutely dreadful," she told me, "and I had to tell someone." "What?" I asked, steeling myself for as many possibilities as I could think of. "I went into a Catholic church and lit a candle." I breathed again. "What's so dreadful about that?" "I'm not a Catholic, and I don't even believe in God, but a friend of mine is very ill, and it's the only thing I could think of doing. It won't work, though, will it?" It was then I remembered my friend, the monk. "Yes it will," I told her. "You can borrow my faith if you like. In fact, any time you want to light candles or even say a prayer, you can pray to the God I believe in."

It is one of the great strengths of our Church, I think, that faith is not our own personal possession, but something we share. When my own faith will not support me, I can draw on the faith of our Church, a Church that includes great examples of faith, like Mother Teresa, as well as numerous other people, unknown to me, who quietly live the Christian life to its fullest. As the same monk told me on another occasion, "When things aren't going too well for you, you can rest in the holiness of others."

Please keep for prayerful reflection.
