Reflection from Father Hilary. Faith 2: A Mature Faith

Faith is indeed fabulous. But it's difficult. People sometimes talk about simple faith as if simple means easy. Faith is never easy. How can we be easy about suffering? If only God would give us a sign! The silence of God is deafening! There's a strong tendency in us to want to see 'signs'. Beware. Jesus was firmly against that tendency. He and His Gospel are the supreme SIGN and this is enough.

We want God to intervene in the silence and suffering. He seems to say nothing. How can we live with that and continue to believe? One way is to accept the Fatherhood of God. In day to day parenthood, a sound parent will stay close to the child when young, giving love, reassurance and trust. But as the years go by, if the parent doesn't let go, the child will never mature. In the Bible we see the pattern of God's dealings with His people. He looks after them tenderly, is very patient, issues warnings. Then, at the end of the New Testament, God the Son Incarnate ascends into heaven. He has taught the apostles and us about coping, trusting and loving and then leaves us to get on with it.

But many of us don't want that. We want to stay in a suspended state of childhood, to hold on too much to God's hand, and we want the Divine parent to intervene, to give us a sign. But God wants us to grow and become mature adults in the faith, taking responsibility for ourselves and the world. This, however, doesn't mean He's not there. He is present profoundly but wills us to get on with it as adult believers, **as if He is not there!**

Now don't get me wrong on this next bit. Devotion to apparitions of Our Lady is perfectly all right provided we have a healthy approach. An unhealthy approach is seeking these 'signs' as if they are necessary. The Church will never enjoin on us belief in such private revelations. The Church's task from the Lord is to promote Revelation – with a capital R. There is nothing in private revelations which isn't already contained in Revelation. Our Lady would smile at the idea of her improving on her Son's Revelation! Are her apparitions a rebuke to a poor quality faith?

We must beware in case we stay at a childish level of faith, thinking we can get answers to every question. Adult faith faces the world boldly not wanting childish reassurance but learning to live with questions and grappling, if needs be, with doubt. Wonderful!
