Reflection from Father Hilary Ministry of the Bedpan

Surely a misprint - bedpan? Not at all. Let me explain. A friend of mine was visiting her daughter in hospital. Her daughter suffered from the terrible disease cystic fibrosis and died in due course. Someone phoned her mother there at the hospital and asked "What are you doing just now?" Her reply: "I'm doing the ministry of the bedpan."

That would strike some as rather odd, exaggerated or even unbecoming. No, no. It is spot on correct. In Church situations we apply 'ministry' to ministers of the Word of God and ministers of the Eucharist. That's right. The word 'minister' is a pure Latin word meaning servant. Hence certain people are called ministers of State and ministers of Religion, simply because they are supposed to serve the people. But every member of the Church is a minister of the Word of God and a minister of the Eucharist commissioned by the Lord Himself by virtue of their Baptism and Confirmation. In what way? By living that Word and living the implications of the Eucharist. The Word of God and the Eucharist in their deepest meaning are the most eloquent sources of all manner of service to be done to God and to his people. This is expressed by exercising the magnificent beauty and costly Love of Christ in sincere dedication and a willing self-sacrificing spirit. Please pause and ponder all that.

Now, back to the bedpan! This will help us realise more clearly 'all manner of service' because the bedpan brings us down to earth – and rightly so. I told you recently about the work of the wonderful Little Brothers of Jesus. One of them was a public lavatory attendant. He said he was invisible - in the sense that no one took any notice of him. But far from that making him feel miserable with self-pity, he was smiling with a deep joy which comes from Christ, not from the world. Look at all the things a mother does for her children, including a lot of messy tasks. And fathers too. All of us, married or single, we all have our tasks.

And let us get this clear - there is no such thing as menial work. I can't stand it when people apply the word 'menial' to certain kinds of work! The Divine Carpenter who created the Universe deliberately became the obscure and humble carpenter at Nazareth. The work of cleaners in hospital is vital as the work of doctors and nurses is vital. So let's fight all snobby attitudes to different kinds of work usually displayed by so-called sophisticated people! So what I am saying is that all your endeavours in the nitty-gritty of life are precious, sacred and truly holy - not least the ministry of the bedpan!

Please keep for prayerful reflection.
