#### **Reflection from Fr. Hilary**

## **Wisdom Amid Modern Technology**

Some time ago, a number of young people agreed to carry out an experiment – to do without their mobiles for a week. Some reactions after the week: Oh, I nearly died..... my world collapsed...... I was never so lonely......... I was miserable etc! Oh dear, oh dear. We laugh, but it is serious too. How on earth did people survive before mobiles?! Nothing wrong of course with having a mobile, although I'm often regarded as being a bit odd because of not having one. I don't mind being with the dinosaurs!

A word about the serious side. Modern technology and the social media are indeed very useful. But their misuse can make them into a kind of a god. Some suffer from a fear of being left out if they don't pursue the latest fashion, get into gossiping, acquire gadgets of all sorts. They crave for cheap popularity and worry about what others think of them. False and dangerous attitudes are often taken on board.

There is a false sense of self which easily pursues shallow values to our detriment. Our true self is what matters, made in the image of God. This emphasises our great Dignity. So we shouldn't be slaves to what is false and superficial. We are offered instead true freedom from Christ. This is freedom of the best kind. It leads to deep, inner peace, whereas slavery causes misery, despondency and lack of self-worth.

**Sunday of the Word of God** is celebrated this weekend. The motto chosen is taken from the Gospel of St John: "Remain in my Word" (John 8,31). To highlight the importance of the Word in Mass and the ministry, there will be a blessing of all readers who currently serve on the rota at all Masses.

- 1. Having a small (pocket-sized) Bible or New Testament.
- 2. Using a Bible App or downloading the Bible onto mobiles eg. Bible Gateway <a href="https://www.biblegateway.com/app/">https://www.biblegateway.com/app/</a>, Pray-As-You-Go <a href="https://pray-as-you-go.org/">https://pray-as-you-go.org/</a> which provides a reflection on a reading from the Mass of the day, plus some of the suggestions given below.
- 3. Praying a scriptural Rosary (eg <a href="https://everydayprayerco.com/blogs/news/praying-scriptural-rosary-pdf">https://everydayprayerco.com/blogs/news/praying-scriptural-rosary-pdf</a> or Stations of the Cross (eg. <a href="https://acollectionofprayers.files.wordpress.com/2021/03/scriptural-way-of-the-cross-2.pdf">https://acollectionofprayers.files.wordpress.com/2021/03/scriptural-way-of-the-cross-2.pdf</a>) or on video (various available on YouTube)
- 4. Set aside some family time for a short reading of a Scripture passage, for example, the Sunday Gospel. Choose a comfortable and quiet place in the home, away from the distractions of television and phones. Begin with a prayer asking the Holy Spirit to open our hearts to God's Word. Read the passage aloud and then allow some time for the family to reflect and share their impressions. Finish with a prayer together that this Word will bear fruit in our lives, helping us in the walk toward holiness
