Reflection from Father Hilary — The Word of God at Mass — and Elsewhere

For your reflection following on from the Sunday of the Word of God which we celebrated last week.

I'd like now to focus on Readers at Mass. However, this concerns everyone in the congregation too. The first thing I want to do is to give you a precious quotation from the Second Vatican Council: "When the Scriptures are read in church it is Christ who proclaims them." Stop now and have a good look at that. It sounds an exaggeration but it is nothing of the sort. The Sacraments of the Church are carried out by Christ through human instruments. The proclamation of the Word of God is truly a sacrament too in which the Lord uses human instruments, that is, you readers. How many realise this? What a privilege! But what a responsibility too! It could put you off being a reader entirely (not necessarily a bad thing) or else make you much more conscientious about becoming a reader of better quality. Which do you want? What a thought that we can hinder Christ as his human instruments.

The reading here in Northfields isn't bad but there is plenty of room for improvement. As a reader, do you first study the reading prayerfully at home? If not, you are failing Christ. You need to prepare properly by making the content of the reading your own so that then you can proclaim it **with strong conviction** as one who really believes it. We should **never** do a reading we haven't prepared. Also, you are not a mere reader – you are a proclaimer. The Word of God deserves proclaiming. **Proclaim** it well. **Open your mouth from North to South and not from East to West!** Have you got that? Speak up from your belly, not just from your mouth! You must put volume into it. Read **slowly**. **Err on the side of slowness**. Nobody ever does! But many err by speeding. Err on the side of slowness so that it can sink in better. All the readers of the Pope's Masses here **read** slowly. **All** these points are utterly essential. If readers do not make great efforts to implement them, they should seriously consider their position as instruments of Christ.

Your task is to grab the rapt attention of the listeners. You cannot presume you have that. You could easily make them switch off! Observe properly the full stops and the commas. Deliver the responsorial psalm slowly and distinctly – it is a prayer. In the bidding prayers please **pause** for a few seconds after each prayer before saying 'Lord, hear us'. Periodically all readers should practise in the empty church with one or more competent people assessing them from the back of the Church. Otherwise you won't easily implement the points being made in this article! Ask members of the congregation for their honest reactions. Ask only those who will tell you what you **need** to hear, not what you might want to hear! Be willing to accept constructive criticism. Indeed be truly grateful for it. Let's have no immature childish self-pity if we're told we need improving. As a reader myself I want to put myself on the top of the list of those to be commented on. I want to be told straight. In case anyone would hesitate to be tough with me, I promise my first reaction will be "many thanks for your criticism." Honest! Let none of us presume we're good readers.

When the Scriptures are read in Church it is Christ himself who proclaims them. Wow!

Racial Justice Sunday Extracts from the message from Bishop Paul McAleenan:.

"The theme of Racial Justice Sunday in England and Wales in 2024 is 'Seeing one another in the life of the Church'....

In the history of the Church, there have been those who looked at the society in which they lived, and responded to what they saw....Alert and sensitive as they were to the commandments of Christ, when they saw justice being denied to someone because of their racial origin or colour, they were prompted to act. Their actions of opposing racism, promoting equality and justice, became their life's work. Following this path, sometimes they encountered hostility, rejection, and attempts to overturn what they were doing... However, they persevered and became instruments of change, agents of progress, and some are acknowledged as saints of the Church.... For Racial Justice Sunday this year, can I suggest that you explore the lives of those great men and women – those who devoted their lives to the pursuit of racial justice, those who emulated God's passion for justice, which we read about in the scriptures. They will inspire us, teach us, and make us sensitive to the importance of racial justice and why we work for it. May we too, like them, see one another in the life of the Church.
