

This Sunday is **Good Shepherd Sunday**, the day we pray for priests and for vocations to the priesthood. Our second collection will support the **Priest Training Fund**. This fund pays for the formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 49 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 13 of whom are from our own Diocese. We also have two seminarians abroad and two on a propaedeutic year. Last year 3 deacons were ordained for Westminster Diocese. The Priest Training Fund also supports the ongoing enrichment and formation of our ordained priests. Your generous donation helps ensure we can support these men. 'I am doing studies in Allen hall seminary here in London and belong to the diocese of Aberdeen, Scotland. Born in the Philippines, worked as a an Intensive Care Nurse and a Nurse Specialist in Pain Manage-

ment at Barts Health Trust, mainly at St Bartholomew's and Royal London Hospitals in the east side of London.

The seed of God's call to serve him in the priesthood was initially planted when I was 8 years old through a vision at the altar with Jesus raising the Holy Host right in front of my eyes. I heard a voice saying, "this is where I want you to be."

The vision of Jesus brought strength, courage, and hope amidst all the challenges, pains, and sufferings throughout my life journey to the present. I felt the great presence of Christ particularly in my day to day work, decisions, and discernment to the vocation for the priesthood.

I left my professional career in 2012, and joined a religious order, lived, studied, worked, and discerned for 9 years before moving to the diocesan vocation.

Christ has been gracious and generous throughout my journey, and as I fully embrace and dedicate my life to God's call to serve, he continually fills me with deep joy, fervour, and immense peace. As I wake up each morning, with utmost gratitude, I always pray, "Here I am Lord, give me the strength and determination to do your will. "

10 years ago, having first heard the call to go to the seminary while I was at university, I made the decision that I did not want this vocation and chose my own path.
