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

The Hope of Eternal Life



Beloved,

Everyone is called to Eternal Life but few hope for it.

Many do not know what Eternal Life is; assume that no one can know either and fail to expect or desire it.

Many desire it but do not feel good enough to attain it.

Many think that they are good enough already and fail to seek the grace without which, it cannot be attained.

The Church is enlivened by the infallible hope of Eternal Life. She has touched, seen and tasted it. She knows that all who expect it, yearn for it and rely on the grace needed to attain it, can hope for it too.

This is why she invites us to celebrate the Resurrection of Christ from the dead at the Easter Vigil during the Holy Night: so that we exercise our expectation and our yearning and dispose our hearts to receive the grace through which we can receive Eternal Life.

To stay awake during the night watching and waiting in spite of hunger, cold or tiredness is a very powerful act of trust in the grace of God that strengthens our expectation and our desire for the appearance of the Risen Lord; it enkindles in us the infallible hope of Eternal Life.

Christ appears to those who hope in Him and when He appears, He pours into their hearts the love that flows between Him and his Father.

This is Eternal Life: to know the Eternal Father and his Son as we are brought to share in the intimacy of their eternal love.

This love is stronger than all the events which have brought bitterness, confusion, pain, guilt shame and misery to our lives.

This love is like the dawn that brings about the doom of night.

In the light of this love all dark events become signs of the victory of divine love; all our wounds become the healing wounds of love that brand the body of The Risen Christ.

You are very welcome to join us at the **Easter Vigi**l during the Holy Night of **Saturday 19th April, from 11:45pm till dawn**.

Come! Receive a foretaste of Eternal Life.

Expect it, desire it, lean on the grace needed to attain it.

In one word: hope!
