IN ILLO UNO UNUM

Beloved ,

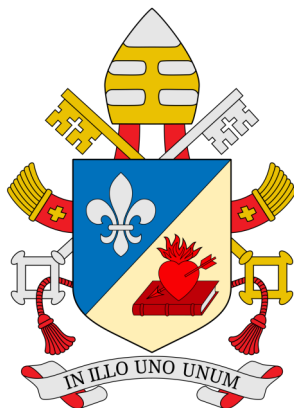
Unity has been a great concern of the Church in the modern world and it will continue to be under Pope Leo XIV as attested by his motto: 'In Illo Uno Unum' ("In the One - that is Christ - we are one").

'Love and Unity' he said at the mass for the beginning of his pontificate, 'are the two dimensions of the mission entrusted to Peter by Jesus'.

And Peter cares especially about these two dimensions because they touch on the mission of every disciple of Jesus, called as we are to love as Christ has loved and to become one through this love.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Love one another: as I have loved you. By this all people will know that you are my disciples' and he asked the Father: 'may all be one ... so that the world may believe that you have sent me'.

'The more faithful and obedient we are to [the Lord Jesus], the more united we are among ourselves.' (Pope Leo XIV to representatives of other churches and ecclesial communities, 19th May 2025)



And the more faithful and obedient we are to the Lord, the more willing we are to establish communion and fraternity with every human being so as to share with all the love of God.

I was reminded of this by the prominent mathematician and Christian apologist John Lenox. His dad, a store owner in Armagh during the troubles, used to hire protestant and catholic labourers alike. Once John asked his dad why he did something so dangerous. He could never forget his father's reply: 'Son -his dad answered-, Scripture teaches us that every man and woman irrespective of what they believe is made in the image and likeness of God, and I intend to treat them like that'.

In the Gospel, in the providential election of Pope Leo XVI and in the witness of those who are faithful and obedient to Christ, God calls us all: 'to be a small leaven of unity, communion and fraternity within the world'. (Pope Leo XIV, Mass for the beginning of his pontificate).

"In the One we are one".
