Adam was a successful artist at the end of the 19th century in Poland.

Revolutionary winds ruffled the land.

Many wanted to make the poor rise to claim their rights through the power of anger.

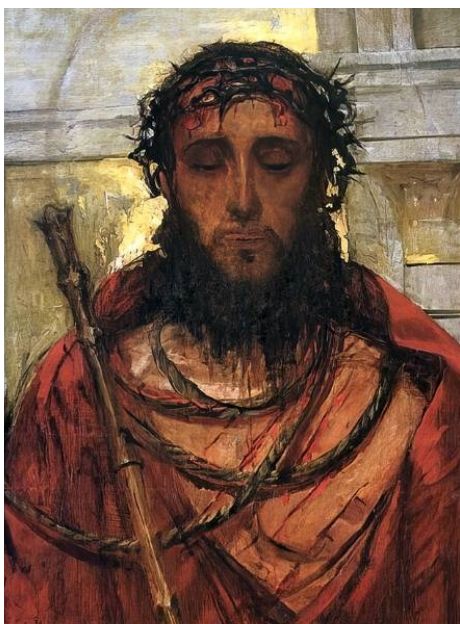
Adam felt called to make them rise through the power of love. He abandoned his career to become one of them.

He completed his most important painting, 'Ecce Homo', at a homeless shelter at the end of the 1880s.

Look at the chest of Jesus in this painting. Do you notice anything unusual?

All of it is a heart.

Jesus lived from the heart. His heart knew the undying strength of his Father's love and could remain gentle in the face of violence and anger. It knew the greatness of his Father's love and could remain humble in the face of insolence

and pride.

This heart, mortally wounded, became the heart of a poor man tormented by the most painful feelings that can torment a soul.

In every Eucharistic miracle where the host has become flesh, laboratories have found

it to be battered tissue from a human heart.

This heart still beats in the Glorious Body of the Risen Lord. It is present at the Eucharist and cannot remain unmoved at the sight of our poverty and suffering, our oppression and misery, our sorrow and distress.

Trust in this heart! This heart has the power to make us gentle and humble children of the Heavenly Father who find their rest in Him and rise through love.

In 1887 Adam assumed a new name, Brother Albert. He was canonized by St John Paul II in 1989. He had become a poor man raised through the power of love.
