Isaiah 53:10-11. If he offers his life in atonement, he shall see his heirs, he shall have a long life. The suffering servant is vindicated and rewarded by the Lord, because he suffered for the sins of others. He will see the light and enjoy happiness. Likewise in Ezekiel 37, Israel is dead in exile but brought back to life when the exile is over.

Psalm 32: May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

Hebrews 4:14-16. Let us be confident in approaching the throne of grace. As we continue with our readings from this letter, we find Jesus, throughout this writing, being compared with the priests of the Jewish Temple. The author however emphasises the superiority of Jesus' priesthood. We are reminded that Jesus was capable of feeling our weaknesses with us.

Mark 10:35-45. The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many. It may be a relief to know that mistaken ambition started really early. Jesus goes on to teach his own way, emphasising that greatness lies in service and a willingness to be servants of all.

Novena to St John Paul II: Bishop John Sherrington has asked that you be made aware of the Novena to St John Paul II, inviting Catholics to pray for the defeat of the Assisted Dying bill, which is due to receive a second reading with a full debate in the House of Lords on 22nd October. The Bishops of England and Wales invite Catholics to respond in prayer to what they believe is a serious threat to the sanctity of life. From October 14th to 22nd, in the lead up to the second reading, Catholics are invited to unite in a Novena of prayer, asking the intercession of St John Paul II, as part of the effort to help defeat this attempt to legalise assisted suicide. Dear Parishioners,
Following advice from the Diocese and consultation among parishioners, Osterley parish will continue to observe some Covid secure measures. These measures are outlined below for your information. Fr. Mark

1. Social distancing at approximately 1 m.
2. Wearing of face masks
3. Employment of 2 part-time stewards
4. Suspension of holy water and communion under both kinds

5. Mass booking to ensure we use only 170 of our 320 seats
6. Frequent cleaning of high risk areas
7. Sanitising of church between 9 and 11.30 mass with fogging machine
8. Use of air handling plant during mass. This replaces the air and does not recycle it.
9. Sundry other measures

* To increase a booking simply book another place if there is a space available.

* If you develop symptoms of Covid, or have a positive test result with or without symptoms, stay at home and self-isolate with your household. Please do not come to church.

MASS REQUESTS: Mass intentions can be requested via e-mail, by ringing the parish office, or using a donation and gift aid envelope from the lobby. Leave a message and telephone number if there is no response. Offerings for masses can be made by cheque or cash deposited in the lobby drop safe, or by BACS transfer (see details below). The minimum Diocesan recommendation is £10. Masses are confirmed upon receipt of the stipend. CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE

Is your child starting school in September 2022?

If you are applying for a reception or Year 7 place in catholic schools, you will need a certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP). You can now apply.

This is only applicable for parents who wish to send their children to a catholic (or Church of England) primary or secondary school.

The Diocese requires that families attend regularly (this means attending Mass every Sunday) for at least two years before a priest is able to sign the Certificate of Catholic Practice (see below).

To assist the parish in signing CCP forms, the parish operates a Mass attendance Card system (see below).

MASS ATTENDANCE CARD

- * Stickers for pupils in school Year 5 and under.
- * Stickers for pupils in Year 9 (for Year 12)
- * Stickers will be given after Mass, before you leave.
- * Stickers are not issued in August

It will be your responsibility to look after the card and bring it every week.

Include your child's full name, passport sized photo and School Year in September 2021.

If he offers his life in atonement, he shall see his heirs, he shall have a long life and through him what the Lord wishes will be done.

His soul's anguish over, he shall see the light and be content.

By his sufferings shall my servant justify many, taking their faults on himself.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 32(33):4-5,18-20,22

Response: May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

The word of the Lord is faithful and all his works to be trusted. The Lord loves justice and right and fills the earth with his love.

The Lord looks on those who revere him, on those who hope in his love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Our soul is waiting for the Lord. The Lord is our help and our shield. May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

Second reading: Hebrews 4:14-16

Our high priest is one who has been tempted in every way that we are

Since in Jesus, the Son of God, we have the supreme high priest who has gone through to the highest heaven, we must never let go of the faith that we have professed. For it is not as if we had a high priest who was incapable of feeling our weaknesses with us; but we have one who has been tempted in every way that we are, though he is without sin. Let us be confident, then, in approaching the throne of grace, that we shall have mercy from him and find grace when we are in need of help.

Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him 'we want you to do

us a favour.’ He said to them, ‘What is it you want me to do for you?’ They said to him, ‘Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.’ ‘You do not know what you are asking’ Jesus said to them. ‘Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?’ They replied, ‘We can.’ Jesus said to them, ‘The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.’

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, ‘You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.’
