CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP):

This is only applicable for parents who wish to send their children to a catholic (or Church of England) primary or secondary school. The Diocese requires that families attend regularly (this means attending Mass every Sunday) for at least two years before a priest is able to sign the Certificate of Catholic Practice. To assist the parish in signing CCP forms, the parish operates a Mass attendance Card system.

MASS ATTENDANCE CARD: Stickers for pupils in school Year 5 and under and Year 9 (for Year 12).

Stickers will be given after Mass, before you leave.

Stickers are not issued in August. It will be your responsibility to look after the card and bring it every week.

September 2021. Once requested by email, cards and stickers can be collected in the lobby of the church after mass. CCP Contact Tel. 07542441846 and leave a message if necessary.
