Exodus 19:2-6. I will count you a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation. Moses proclaims the message of God's covenant with the people of Israel. He is the empowered leader whose task is to serve the Israelites by offering them the conditions for living in a close relationship with the Lord.

Romans 5:6-11. Now that we have been reconciled by the death of his Son, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son. Paul speaks of humanity's reconciliation with God because of Christ's death. The act of reconciliation means God's former enemies become God's intimates. The result is that those once estranged can now boast of God himself – a great contrast with their previous fear of God's wrath.

Matthew 9:36-10:8. He summoned his twelve disciples and sent them out. Matthew has Jesus pronounce his mission discourse. He summons the Twelve and shares his mission with them. They are to serve others by proclaiming the arrival of the kingdom as Jesus did. As the powers conferred by Jesus are gratuitous, their use of such powers is also to be gratuitous.

Mass intentions can be requested via the parish office, e-mail, or by using a donation envelope from the lobby, which allows you to gift aid your offering. Offerings may be submitted by cheque or cash deposited in the lobby drop safe in a marked envelope, by BACS transfer (see bank details below), or by using the contactless machines. The minimum Diocesan recommendation is £10. Masses are confirmed upon receipt of the stipend. If the requested date is already booked, the next available date will be allocated. In the event of a funeral, weekday masses may have to be rescheduled.

A CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) will be required for applications to Catholic (or Church of England & Faith) primary or secondary schools. The Diocese requires that families attend regularly (this means attending Mass every Sunday) for at least two years before a priest is able to sign the CCP. To assist the priest in signing the certificate, the parish operates a Mass Attendance Card system (see below). ST THOMAS MORE & ST JOHN FISHER, MARTYRS - 2/6/23: Both saints held high office in England but submitted to martyrdom, rather than accept Henry VIII's claim to be head of the Church.

St John Fisher was a learned teacher and chancellor at Cambridge university, and Bishop of Rochester in 1504 aged 35. When asked to accept the King as head of the Church he said he could not. "I do not condemn any other men's consciences," he said. "Their consciences must save them and mine must save me." He was tried and executed for treason on June 17 1535 aged 66.

St Thomas More was the Lord Chancellor. He had a large family to support and did not wish to die. "I am not so holy that I dare rush upon death," he said. But he could not accept the King as supreme head of the Church or condone his divorce. Rather than make a public pronouncement he resigned from his post and hoped to retire quietly. But the King would not accept his silence. St Thomas was arrested, imprisoned at the Tower of London for 15 months and then declared guilty of treason and condemned to death. He was executed nine days after St John Fisher. He was 57. From the scaffold he said: "I die the King's good servant, but God's first."
