Learning What You Live

Today: Sunday—The Feast of the Holy Family

When the Infant Jesus was presented at the temple, Simeon told Mary and Joseph, "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed...." Then Joseph and Mary returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. "And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him."

But remember Jesus was fully human and had to be taught many things in exactly the same way that we all had to learn from our parents and teachers as we grew up. Mary and Joseph had a very important job to do. In fact they were given a job that is not so different from any parent's job, to give the growing child a sense of worth, security, wisdom and love.

There is a school where the famous verses of Dorothy Nolte are pinned up in each classroom. The piece is entitled 'Children Learn What They Live'. It begins, "....If children live with criticism, they learn to condemn. If children live with hostility they learn to fight. If children live with fear, they learn to be apprehensive." In other words, we teach by our example. If we want our children to be truthful then we ourselves must be honest. If we want our children to learn justice, we must ourselves be fair. If we want our children to learn respect, we must first of all treat them with kindness and consideration. Whether we are parents, stepparents, grandparents, guardians, aunt or uncles, we must follow the example set by the Holy Family and live the lives we want our children to live.


January 1st- Solemnity of Mary Mother of God
