PRISONERS' SUNDAY

This Sunday we mark Prisoners' Sunday, the National Day of Prayer and Action for prisoners and their families. Prisoner's Sunday is an opportunity for us all to direct our thoughts to the needs of prisoners, their families, and their children, to pray for them and to reflect on the ways we can make a difference to the lives of those who are affected by the criminal justice system.

PACT is the national Catholic charity supporting prisoners, people with convictions, defendants and their families. They continue to be a shining example of strength and conviction. PACT continues to bring hope in a very difficult environment: hope to families and children who have suffered prolonged separation; hope to those who have been confined to their cells for 23 hours a day for over a year; hope to those like Michael whose story you can read in the PACT's packs.

WALSINGHAM - PILGRIMAGE OF REPARATION & PRAYER FOR THE SANCTITY OF LIFE

Saturday 23rd October, from midday

There will be a pilgrimage for the sanctity of life in Walsingham with the theme, 'the courage to proclaim the Gospel of Life on post-pandemic Britain'.

Outline of the day

The main programme commences with midday Mass in the Chapel of Reconciliation celebrated by Bishop Mark Davies (Shrewsbury) with Fr Jeremy Davies and Fr David Donaghue. The day will include opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to spend time before the Blessed Sacrament. This time will include the Holy Rosary, Stations of the Cross, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Litany of Life and Benediction.

Mid-afternoon will herald the change of location from the Shrine to the Priory in the village, walking the Pilgrim Way, to the original site of the Holy House of Nazareth. This is the now traditional silent walk, a prayerful walk with Jesus to Calvary.

While the focus is prayer and reparation for sins against life, the pilgrimage is also a chance for those attending to spend time in the peace and quiet of England's Nazareth
