This Thursday is the Solemnity of Ascension; when we recall forty days after Jesus had resurrected from the dead, He then ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of God the Father in glory. It draws the eyes of every scientific observer that Jesus' resurrection from the dead and ascension into heaven seem to undermine the law of nature and the law of universal gravitation. Firstly, when the incorruptible soul goes out of the human body, the person dies and the corruptible body stays dead. But three days after Jesus' death, he came back to life; body and soul intact. Secondly, forty days after his resurrection, he ascended into heaven body and soul. Naturally, humans do not ascend like Jesus did. I am sure God has His reasons whenever He intervenes in our lives with miracles and wonders which is beyond explanation and the confines of human understanding. Jesus ascended to heaven because His work on earth is accomplished, and He has entrusted His Father's work to His disciples with the following words; Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time. The command Jesus gave is LOVE. We are called to be missionary of LOVE IN ACTION! Fr Chinedu

**ACTION PRAYER:** The theme of our readings this weekend is love. When filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter's listeners understood that God's love was for everyone including the pagans.
