Gospel Matthew 16:13-19 – Peter declares that Jesus is the Messiah; and Jesus proclaims that he will build his church on the rock that is Peter.

On this feast of Saints Peter and Paul, we give thanks for their example and renew our commitment to pass on to others the message of the Gospel of Jesus.
