- *Sports materials for school and parish youth (footballs, volleyballs, jerseys/t-shirts (M), shorts.
- *Assorted clothes—Summer clothes only it is very hot all year round (for both boys and girls-children, teenagers and adults)

ACTION PRAYER: In our readings this week Wisdom is spelled with a capital letter, the word of God is alive and active and the "riches" of this world can be a hindrance to gaining entry to heaven.

Perhaps another way to sum up the readings is: Wisdom is to understand how God's words are alive and active in finding the gate to heaven. The 'eye of the needle' is also the name of one of Jerusalem's gates that is very narrow and a camel ladened with goods can't access the gate... Wisdom. She brings the alive and active aspect of the Word of God. Her type of riches will serve us in both this world and the next. **Our Action Prayer**, while contemplating, is to ask Wisdom to help enable us to be a conduit of Divine Love, and that all graces given to us, are fully given to God's creation via our actions to all those around us. In other words, to help us recognise the true riches that will help us enter the gate to heaven.
