October is the month of the Holy Rosary. The word Rosary means "crown of roses." St. Louis De Montfort calls the Rosary "the mystical rose tree of Jesus and Mary in life, death, and eternity." He tells us that reciting the Rosary produces spiritual roses which will "never wilt or die, and they will be just as exquisite thousands of years from now as they are today."

Saint John Paul II tells us that "the Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at the heart a Christocentric prayer. In the sobriety of its elements, it has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety, of which it can be said to be a compendium. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer."

So! As we begin the month of October, I would like to encourage everybody to try, especially if you did not try it before, to say the rosary every day through the month, on your own or as a family. In our parish, Rosary is prayed every morning after 9.30am Mass on weekdays. I am sure many of you are following the news on the conflict in the Middle East. Let us ask our Lady Queen of Peace and the Comforter of the Afflicted to intercede for our troubled world.
