

FR ANDREW WRITES

You may be aware that the Church around the world has been going through a process of reflection centred around the Synod of Bishops on Synodality. The focus of this process is to renew the mission of the Church in the world by building up communion and increasing participation.

Cardinal Vincent has asked the parishes of the diocese to gather to reflect particularly on the following questions:

- 1. How do we witness as a Parish and proclaim our faith to: those who have never heard of Christ; Christians who don't come to Church; Christians who do come to Church?
- 2. How could we organise ourselves as a parish to do this more effectively?
- 3. What formation, training or input might help us to proclaim our faith more effectively?
- 4. What are we doing now that hinders our mission and what should we start doing that we are not currently doing?

Unfortunately, we have not been given much time for this process of reflection as we are required to report back via a meeting of deans on 6th March. In order to ensure that we are able to contribute to that process in the diocese which will then feed back to Rome we will need to have a meeting this month!

We will therefore have a meeting for Poplar Parish on Saturday 24th February at 2pm in the Guild <u>Room</u>

and for Limehouse Parish on Saturday 2nd March at 2pm in the hall. Everyone is welcome to attend these meetings where we will reflect on the questions outlined above.

It would be great for anyone who is interested in furthering the mission of our parishes to attend (and not just the usual suspects). However, don't worry if you cannot because you can always give me your thoughts beforehand and, in any event, I intend that we should keep this reflection going in our parishes over the coming months as we seek to build up our parishes especially in the way we reach out to the world around us.

MASS THIS SUNDAY - The 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

First reading

Job 7:1-4,6-7

Job began to speak: "Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service, his time no better than hired drudgery? Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief.

Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?' Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!' Restlessly I fret till twilight falls. Swifter than a weaver's shuttle my days have passed, and vanished, leaving no hope behind. Remember that my life is but a breath, and that my eyes will never again see joy.

<u>Response to the Psalm</u> Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.

Second reading

1 Corinthians 9:16-19,22-23

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me. So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessings.

<u>Gospel</u>

Mark 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them. That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was. In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.
