ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

Cf. Mal 3:1; 1 Chr 29:12 Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kingship is in his grasp, and power and dominion.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 60:1-6 Above you the glory of the Lord appears.

PSALM: Ps 71:1-2.7-8.10-13.R.cf.v11

R) All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord.

O God, give your judgement to the king, to a king's son your justice, that he may judge your people in justice and your poor in right judgement. (R)

In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails. He shall rule from sea to sea, from the Great River to earth's bounds. (R)

The kings of Tarshish and the sea coasts shall pay him tribute.
The kings of Sheba and Seba shall bring him gifts.
Before him all kings shall fall prostrate, all nations shall serve him. (R)

For he shall save the poor when they cry and the needy who are helpless. He will have pity on the weak and save the lives of the poor. (R)

GOSPEL REFLECTION



"The wise (prudent) man's path leads upwards to life," so reads Proverbs 15: 24. This is certainly true of the "wise men ... from the east" who came to Jerusalem seeking the "infant king of the Jews". That infant king is indeed life, eternal life. The "way" too, because he IS wisdom. And if the translation should be 'prudence', prudence is a wisdom with regard to action, to decisions. These wise men wisely sought him who IS wisdom, journeyed many miles to find him. They also found her who is Wisdom's greatest

disciple; she who is the "seat of Wisdom", his Mother, whose wisdom believing and obeying overshadowed even theirs. Mary is, of all human beings, the most perfect 'image' of the wisdom of her Son. She, a woman, has of all mankind the greatest dignity and importance after her Son. She is queen of angels, of prophets, of patriarchs, of apostles, of martyrs, of confessors, of virgins, of ALL saints! She is God's triumph in fallen human nature of grace and wisdom, love and beauty.

142 (Cont'd). In the homily, truth goes hand in hand with beauty and goodness. Far from dealing with abstract truths or cold syllogisms, it communicates the beauty of the images used by the Lord to encourage the practise of good. The memory of the faithful, like that of Mary, should overflow with the wondrous things done by God. Their hearts, growing in hope from the joyful and practical exercise of the love which they have received, will sense that each word of Scripture is a gift before it is a demand.

UBERTINO DA CASALE, THE TREE OF THE CRUCIFIED LIFE OF JESUS

Francis, ever growing in likeness to Jesus, realized that while he was at home in the body he was exiled from the Lord, that he had become, through the charity of Christ Jesus, altogether unaffected by external things and earthly desires. This made him strive, by means of unremitting prayer, to keep his spirit ever in the presence of God. Prayer was a solace to this contemplative who, going the rounds of the mansions above, had already become a fellow citizen of the angels, gazing upon their secrets. With burning desire he was seeking his Beloved, from whom the only partition separating him was his flesh. Prayer was likewise a safeguard to this man of action who, rather than rely on his own efforts in everything he undertook, would ask in persevering prayer to be guided by the blessed Jesus. By every possible means he would urge his brothers to be earnest in prayer.

He was so constant himself in giving time to prayer that, whether walking, sitting down, working or resting, indoors or outside, he seemed to be always praying. It was as though he had dedicated to holy prayer, not only heart and body, but every piece of his activity and time.
