THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD 8TH JANUARY 2017

SUNDAY THOUGHT

Every year, sometimes every week, new “rising stars” appear on the horizon of the sports world, the entertainment stage, the political arena. We expect great things out of these stars, and when our expectations are not met we might ask ourselves, what were we looking for? And we begin to look elsewhere. But where is *that* elsewhere?

Not finding what they expected in Jerusalem, the wise men changed what they were looking for and where they were seeking it. The wise men were looking for Jesus in Jerusalem, but he was in Bethlehem. They were looking for a Jewish king, but they found the Messiah-King for all peoples at all times.

Expectations shape our vision and our journey through life. But we must always be ready for God to break in and shatter the limits of our expectations and lead us in a new direction. Then we might find “the new-born king” among the poor, the homeless, those suffering persecution and injustice. Then we might find him in the truth of what our children might say to us, in the simplest daily activity done out of humility and love, in listening to someone else’s ideas and dreams. When we allow God to expand the vision of our expectations, we find much more. We find “the new-born king” ever born anew in our hearts, the true rising star whose light will never fade.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE –MAY/JUNE 2017

As many of you will know, I had been planning a walking pilgrimage to Santiago di Compostela for May 2017. Due to difficulties in arranging suitable flight times, I have decided to postpone this pilgrimage until 2018. However, I have now arranged an alternative pilgrimage from **Tuesday 30th May to Sunday 4th June 2016** to the early saints of northern England in Northumbria and Holy Island (Lindisfarne). We will be based in Newcastle, from where we will visit Durham, Jarrow and Monkwearmouth (home of St Bede), Inner Farne Island and Holy Island. The cost of the pilgrimage including travel to and from Newcastle by train, accommodation at the Premier Inn, Newcastle, breakfasts and dinners will be £699 per person (single room supplement = £180 for the 5 nights). We are also able to offer a great deal for families with two children under 15 willing to share a family room (4 people) – the children’s price would be £299 each.

The itinerary and booking forms are available in the parishes this weekend and are also downloadable from the parish websites. If you would like to join this pilgrimage please do consider booking before 27th January 2017, as the price is fixed only until that time. *Fr Shaun*

URGENT APPEAL FOR CHILDREN'S LITURGY VOLUNTEERS
