## THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) - 11<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2018

### SUNDAY THOUGHT

Our readings today feature two destitute widows. The widow from Zarephath, on the verge of dying from malnutrition, gives Elijah the very last bit of food that she has, in an act of complete faith and charity. In the Gospel Jesus notices the widow at the temple humbly giving away her last coins, all that she has left to survive on. For the Jews, the practice of almsgiving was a way of recognising that all goods and gifts belong to God, and that he has entrusted the more fortunate to distribute those gifts to those in need - not out of pity, but out of the justice which human dignity requires. The widows, both materially poor and "poor in spirit" (Mt. 5:3) put all their trust in God's providence in their selfless sacrifices. Jesus uses the example of the widow at the temple to remind his disciples of this fundamental truth: that as people made in the image of God, we have a responsibility to give unselfishly to others. Today's Gospel comes right at the end of Jesus' public ministry, just before his eventual arrest and crucifixion, and points to Jesus' personal readiness to sacrifice everything, even his own life, for the true peace of the world.

This weekend, on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of the Great War, we remember those millions of men - our family members - who also sacrificed their lives to restore peace to the world. Many war memorials - carved onto stones in every village and every town the length and breadth of Europe - point to this profound parallel between the sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of these men by bearing Jesus' words: "Greater love hath no man than this" (that a man lay down his life for his friends) (Jn 15:13). We honour the sacrifice and service of those we remember today when we adopt their selflessness, and by looking outside of ourselves, beyond our own needs, when we create communities that are safe and where all people can live in peace and dignity.

Please read the letter carefully, as it contains **very important** information regarding what is required of you in order for us to be able to provide a Certificate of Catholic Practice for your family. *Please note that St John the Evangelist Primary School and St Anthony's Primary School no longer require a CCP for the 2020 school admissions.*

### OPEN PARISH MEETINGS

Earlier in the autumn there was an open parish meeting in each parish to discuss three important matters affecting the life of the parishes: (i) The draft Terms of Reference for the new Joint Parish Pastoral Council; (ii) The future provision of the Holy Week Triduum and (iii) a proposal for the adoption of a common identifying name for our three parishes. I wish to express my thanks to all the parishioners who attended those meetings and for the important questions they raised. On 27<sup>th</sup> October there was a joint meeting of the parish pastoral councils of the three parishes, with the express purpose of discussing the questions raised by parishioners and deciding the right way forward on each of these issues. ### WATFORD DEANERY

Cardinal Vincent Nichols has appointed Fr Shaun as Dean of Watford. This means that, in addition to his duties as parish priest of the three parishes, Fr Shaun will now have some responsibilities for the care of the clergy and parishes of the Watford Deanery and will represent them at Diocesan level. Fr Shaun has been appointed to this office for a term of three years.

### PARISH FINANCIAL AUDITS

In October all three parishes underwent a comprehensive diocesan financial audit. I am delighted to inform parishioners that all three parishes passed the audit with flying colours: Rickmansworth 95%, Chorleywood 98% & Mill End 98%! I wish to express my sincere thanks to Mark Blayney, Carolyn Opie and Sandra Miller, the respective Chairs of the three Finance Committees, and to all the members of the finance committees for their hard work, prudence and diligence in working with me to assure the sound financial management of the three parishes. Special thanks are due to Kerry Van Rensburg, our exceptional Parish Administrator, who handles all the book-keeping for the three parishes – and much more besides. To paraphrase one of the Finance Chairs: *“Kerry provides the bedrock which enables us to do our jobs and does it three times over with unfailing patience, calmness and good humour. We would all be lost without her!”* I couldn't have put it better myself! *Fr Shaun*
