FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT 7TH APRIL 2019

SUNDAY THOUGHT

In today's Gospel Jesus is confronted by the scribes and the Pharisees, who bring before him a woman caught in the act of adultery. The Pharisees were the Jewish religious leaders. They were well educated, well known, and reputed to be men of wisdom and high moral standards. But as the story unfolds, we discover that they are ruthless, calculating and hypocritical. In their pride and arrogance they look down upon this women, seeing her as nothing; a life to be thrown away in their war against Jesus. They stand over her, judging and condemning from their position of moral superiority.

Jesus cared about the law, but he cared about people more. "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her" - Jesus' words strike at the hearts of the Pharisees, opening them to the realisation that they too are sinners, and not one of them can claim to be stain-free. Every one of us is like this woman, and these Pharisees - all sinners who are truly guilty in the eyes of God. Whenever we confront wrongdoing we must refrain from judgement and humbly consider our own sins and transgressions. Jesus does not say that sin doesn't matter, because sin does matter and damages our relationship with God.

In his compassion, Jesus forgives the adulterous woman and restores her dignity, because he loves her (just as he loves all sinners), and because he loves her, he wants what is best for her - to live from this point on a life of loving union with God. "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more." This is the gift and graces we are given in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and precisely the attitude we should bring: a true repentance with a firm intention to amend our lives.

THE VEILING OF CROSSES AND STATUES

From the 5th Sunday of Lent until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday the crosses and statues of our churches are veiled in purple cloths. The veiling of crosses and images is a sort of "fasting" from sacred depictions which represent the paschal glory of our salvation. Just as the Lenten fast concludes with the Paschal feast, so too, our fasting from the cross culminates in an adoration of the holy wood on which the sacrifice of Calvary was offered for our sins. Likewise, a fasting from the glorious images of the mysteries of faith and the saints in glory culminates on the Easter night with a renewed appreciation of the glorious victory won by Christ, risen from the tomb to win for us eternal life.

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER LEAFLET

Copies of the Holy Week and Easter leaflet, giving the times of all the Masses and liturgies over Holy Week and Easter are available this weekend. Please be sure to take one home with you.

EASTER OFFERING ENVELOPES

The offerings at the Easter Day Masses are your personal gift to your priests. The Christmas and Easter offerings, together with the stole fees and Mass stipends form the personal income paid by the parishes to Fr Shaun and Fr Damian. These monies are paid into the respective three parishes' accounts and are then paid to the priests as a monthly salary or stipend. DAY OF PRAYER FOR SURVIVORS OF ABUSE – FRIDAY 12th APRIL 2019

In February 2016, Pope Francis asked each Bishops' Conference to establish a Day of Prayer for Survivors of Abuse. In response, the Bishops of England and Wales designated the Friday of the Fifth Week of Lent to be observed as this Day of Prayer. This year, therefore, the Day of Prayer is Friday 12th April. Cardinal Vincent Nichols has asked that this Day of Prayer be observed in the parishes of our Diocese. Day by day, the pain of those who have suffered abuse, and its lasting corrosive impact, are brought more fully into the light. The pain of that betrayal of trust is all the more profound when the abuse took place within the community of the Catholic Church. We also see so clearly the failures in leadership in the Church that have exacerbated the sufferings of those who have been abused. We have plenty of reasons to pray. We pray for those who bear this pain. We pray for their strength and perseverance. We pray for those who have been caught up in the circles of mistrust, si lence and complicity which emanate from this abuse. We seek repentance and renewal for all who have failed in their duty to protect and respond to the victims of these crimes. We pray for a renewal in the life of our Church that has become a lodging place for this evil. We pray in confidence that the Lord does not abandon His Church but constantly calls us to purify our ways of life. We pray with Mary, our holy Mother, and finest expression of our Holy Mother, the Church. Consequently, on Friday 12th April we will have an extended period of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at Our Lady's, after the 9.30am Mass – from 10.00am until 2.00pm. Special prayers for victims and survivors of abuse will be available for use by individuals. In each parish this weekend there will be a sign-up list for those who would be willing to commit to praying before the Blessed Sacrament for half an hour or an hour. Fr Shaun
