### SUNDAY THOUGHT

The people in today's gospel are following Jesus, although they don't know where he is going - to his trial and crucifixion. They are following him because they want improved lives; to get rich, to get healthy, and to have security. But Jesus wants to give them another life, so he stops them and challenges them. He initially does so in the strong language about "hating" one's "father, mother, wife, children, etc.". However the meaning of "hate" is not the same as our English expression - here it means more to detach oneself; to be prepared to let go of, or to leave aside. Jesus is asking the people to give up on the things of this world.

Many people are attached to material possessions, some are unhealthily attached to relationships, others to their ambitions and dreams. But Jesus is telling us that to follow him we must leave whatever distracts our attention from God, and to put him first and foremost, always. He emphasises our free will - we are not forced into discipleship and (unlike the crowds) we have full knowledge of the requirements. He encourages discernment, that we "first sit down and calculate the cost" - like the tower builder, do we appreciate the cost of the journey? Like the king, do we appreciate the enormity of the task?

To be a Christian is to have a goal: we are going somewhere, and to get there we are following someone: Jesus Christ. Choices leading us away from following Christ have a veneer, a false shine. When we are struggling to remain faithful and observant to the teaching of Jesus, it can seem easier to lapse. But time and again the "good things" of the world are shown to be fleeting, impermanent and even the cause of a deeper emptiness. What the world seems to offer as freedom can quickly become compulsion and slavery to empty promises. The only people who are truly free are those with nothing left to lose; they desire nothing and are afraid of nothing. Their treasure, all that matters to them, lies in God alone, and cannot be taken away.

### WALKING PILGRIMAGE – VIA FRANCIGENA (TUSCAN SECTION) – 23<sup>RD</sup> MAY TO 31<sup>ST</sup> MAY 2020

Following the great success of our 2018 Camino to Santiago di Compostela, I am organising another walking pilgrimage. This time we will walk the Tuscany section of the ancient **Via Francigena** from Lucca to Siena. There will be five walking days, with the longest day being 24km and the shortest 13km. Providing we can gather a group of 20 or more pilgrims the cost per person sharing a twin/double room will be 1,115 euros. Breakfasts and dinners, coach transfers from and to Pisa airport, daily baggage transfers and the services of a local guide are all included. Single room supplement will be 270 euros, though only five single rooms will be available at this price (based on a group size of twenty). Flights to and from Pisa will be booked individually by the pilgrims (details of the preferred flight will be provided in good time).
