### PENTECOST SUNDAY (YEAR A) – 31<sup>st</sup> MAY 2020

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

Pentecost Sunday celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit. The faith and unity present in our Christian communities today is made possible by the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The First Reading today, from Acts, narrates the initial events associated with the descent of the Holy Spirit onto the Apostles. Luke, in his Gospel, foreshadowed this with words of John the Baptist: “I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than me is coming ... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire” (Luke 3:16). The association of the image of fire with the Holy Spirit is significant. In the Old Testament, fire symbolizes God’s presence in the covenant at Mount Sinai (Exodus 19:18). In the New Testament, fire symbolizes the transformative power of the Holy Spirit. As the fire came to rest on the Apostles, ‘they were all filled with the Holy Spirit,’ transforming them and enabling them to proclaim the resurrected Christ to the large crowds gathered in Jerusalem.

We hear in the Second Reading, from Paul, how the presence of the Holy Spirit brought the gift of faith and unity to the new-born Church. Paul tells the Christian community in Corinth that no one professes faith that “Jesus is Lord” without the Holy Spirit. It is this common profession that unites and benefits the community: “The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.”

In the Gospel reading for today from John, we hear how Jesus, on Easter Sunday, gave the disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The risen Christ “came and stood among them.” and spoke to them saying: “Peace be with you.” Then Jesus breathed on them saying “Receive the Holy Spirit.” From the beginning, the peace of the community was linked to the presence of the Holy Spirit.

It is the Holy Spirit who unifies us in the Body of Christ, gives us Jesus’ love of God and of neighbour, frees us, and makes us God’s own. The challenge for each of us to try to discover more deeply each day how the receiving of the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and Confirmation is meant to strengthen and empower us in the mission that Christ himself us given to us: namely to become and be his missionary disciples in the world.

On Tuesday of this past week, in my capacity as Dean of Watford, I attended a “Zoom” meeting of the Westminster Diocesan Deans with the Cardinal and the Auxiliary Bishops. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the procedures we will all need to put in place for the re-opening of our churches for **individual prayer**. As I write this on Friday afternoon we are still awaiting a decision from the government as to whether and when places of worship might be allowed to re-open for individual prayer. Any decision about the re-commencement of public worship (Mass) is still some time away.

In advance of a decision about the re-opening of churches **solely** for individual prayer, the Cardinal has asked all priests to make a risk assessment of their churches and to purchase the necessary social-distancing and hygiene equipment which we will need in order to safely re-open churches for individual prayer.

It has been made clear to us that social distancing and hygiene guidelines must be strictly adhered to. Whenever a church is open for individual prayer stewards must be present, and at the end of each opening period the church will have to undergo a very thorough domestic clean. You will realise from this that we are going to need a lot of help from parishioners in order to safely re-open even for periods of individual prayer.

Once a decision has been made by the government and the diocese as to when churches can re-open for individual prayer, it is my intention - and only after I am confident after all the social distancing and hygiene measures are in place - to re-open Our Lady's, Rickmansworth, for some periods for individual prayer. At this stage I cannot tell you which days or for how long. This will largely depend upon decisions made at a deanery level and upon the level of response we have from parishioners with regard to stewarding and cleaning of the church.


St John Fisher, Chorleywood and St John Evangelist, Mill End, will not be opening for individual prayer. You will be aware that neither of these churches are usually open outside of Mass times, and with no resident priest on-site, the logistics of opening either of these churches for individual prayer would be extremely challenging.

I stress again that at this stage we are only talking about re-opening for individual prayer and, as yet, we do not know for sure if or when the government will allow us to do so. Once permission is given we will need to be sure that all social-distancing and hygiene measures are in place before we move to re-open Our Lady's for some periods of individual prayer.

This is going to be a very challenging exercise and we ask for your patience and support as we prepare to take these steps. Our primary concern is for the safety of our parishioners and for everyone visiting our church for individual prayer. As things become clearer I will be appealing for help with stewarding and cleaning from those who are not in vulnerable groups and I will be providing more specific information about how these times for individual prayer will work in practice.

As this weekend we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost, let us each ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with the spiritual fruits of the Spirit which we all need in these challenging days: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

## **FEELING DISCONNECTED?**

Are you feeling disconnected from parish life? Do you miss your community, and priests? We are missing you! Please, join us, and your parish community, in our new **online parish bible study programme and prayer (Lectio Divina) group**. The programme runs in two sessions each week. We invite you to attend both Sessions each week, but even if you can only attend one or the other, we hope that you will find it helpful in this time when we cannot gather physically as a Church community.

### **Online Bible Study programme – Monday evenings at 7.30pm**

Session One each week we will take a look at short passage of scripture (from the Acts of the Apostles) and delve into its historical and biblical context, how it would have been understood by the Early Church, what it says about God, and what it has to say to us today. No previous experience of bible study is necessary. Fr Shaun will lead this via 'Zoom', following up-to-date security measures. It will last between 45 minutes to an hour. ### **CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE - STICKERS**

Parents who will be seeking a Certificate of Catholic Practice for September 2021 Catholic Secondary Transfer or a September 2021 place at a Catholic Nursery or in Reception year may be concerned about what will happen with regard to our sticker system during the suspension of the public celebration of Mass. **Please do not be anxious about this.** Each Sunday during the period of the suspension of the public celebration of Mass will be removed from our assessment of Sunday Mass attendance. We will only take account of the Sundays when Sunday Mass has been publically celebrated. This will mean that the suspension of Sunday Mass will have no effect upon the issuing of Certificates of Catholic Practice.
