### SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A) – 17th MAY 2020

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

In the readings for this Sunday we hear how all who believed in Jesus – Jews, Gentiles, and Samaritans alike were sustained by the presence of the Holy Spirit in their midst.

In the Gospel reading, which continues Jesus’ great farewell discourse from last Sunday, Jesus tells the disciples about “another Advocate” (often translated as “Counsellor” or “Comforter”). In John’s Gospel account, Jesus was the first Advocate, sent from the Father in heaven. Jesus now reveals the second Advocate to his disciples as he prepares them for his suffering and death, Resurrection, and Ascension. The Advocate is “the Spirit of truth”, the “Holy Spirit”, who represents the continuing presence of Jesus on earth among his disciples. Jesus assures the disciples, “I will not leave you orphans,” a promise fulfilled when Jesus ascends into heaven and the Holy Spirit descends onto the community of believers.

In the First Reading, we hear of Philip’s successful evangelization among the Samaritans. Luke tells us that Philip performed signs (exorcising demon-possessed people and curing those who were paralyzed or crippled).

Because of this, the Samaritans listened to Philip as he “proclaimed ‘the Christ to them’ and they were “baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.” As a result, Peter and John were sent to lay hands on the Samaritans so that they too would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate.

When Peter wrote his letter to the Gentile churches of Asia Minor, the gift of the Holy Spirit was a visible sign and a reason to hope. The same Spirit that brought Jesus to life was now present in their Gentile communities. Peter saw that the presence of the Holy Spirit fulfilled what Jesus promised to his disciples and would not leave them orphans. Jesus remained and remains fully present to all Christians.

Although this week we have seen the beginnings of a loosening of the restrictions around the lockdown, we all know that we still have a way to go before we will be able to think about gathering for Sunday Mass in our churches once again. From the government guidelines, it seems that the possibility of allowing public worship will be under consideration from July onwards. There are many factors, both national and local, which will have to be taken into account before we can safely start gathering in our churches again to worship the Lord. Until then we all have to be patient. I am greatly encouraged by the numbers of you who are sharing in the celebration of Sunday (and often weekday Mass) via livestreaming from parishes in the UK and around the world. If you have not yet taken the opportunity to attend Mass via livestreaming, and you have the facility at home to do so, I strongly encourage you to give it a go. It is important in this time of lockdown, that we don’t lose touch with the practice of our faith, with the discipline of setting aside a dedicated time each Sunday to share in the worship

of God and participate (albeit remotely) in the celebration of Mass.

Although we do not have the facility to be able to live-stream from our any of our three parishes, we are using online technology to engage with our parishioners via *Zoom* and *Facebook*. I am delighted that we have over 70 parishioners each week taking part in our Online Bible Study and nearly 50 taking part in online prayer through *Lectio Divina*. I encourage you to come and join us in these initiatives. The more the merrier! You will find more details about how to do so further down this newsletter.

In the second reading today St Peter exhorts us all to ‘Reverence the Lord Christ’ in our hearts. I encourage you to do all that you can, within what is possible for you in your own particular circumstances, to make room for Christ, to be still in his presence, so that you may receive the gift of his peace which he longs to share with you – as his heart speaks to yours.

## FEELING DISCONNECTED?

Are you feeling disconnected from parish life? Do you miss your community, and priests? We are missing you! Please, join us, and your parish community, in our new **online parish bible study programme and prayer (Lectio Divina) group**. The programme runs in two sessions each week. We invite you to attend both Sessions each week, but even if you can only attend one or the other, we hope that you will find it helpful in this time when we cannot gather physically as a Church community.

### **Online Bible Study programme – Monday evenings at 7.30pm**

Session One each week we will take a look at short passage of scripture (from the Acts of the Apostles) and delve into its historical and biblical context, how it would have been understood by the Early Church, what it says about God, and what it has to say to us today. No previous experience of bible study is necessary. Fr Shaun will lead this via 'Zoom', following up-to-date security measures. It will last between 45 minutes to an hour. ## CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE - STICKERS

Parents who will be seeking a Certificate of Catholic Practice for September 2021 Catholic Secondary Transfer or a September 2021 place at a Catholic Nursery or in Reception year may be concerned about what will happen with regard to our sticker system during the suspension of the public celebration of Mass. **Please do not be anxious about this.** Each Sunday during the period of the suspension of the public celebration of Mass will be removed from our assessment of Sunday Mass attendance. We will only take account of the Sundays when Sunday Mass has been publically celebrated. This will mean that the suspension of Sunday Mass will have no effect upon the issuing of Certificates of Catholic Practice.
