THE MOST HOLY TRINITY (YEAR A) – 7th JUNE 2020

A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

The First Reading for this Trinity Sunday, from the Book of Exodus, presents two important aspects of our Triune God: mercy and fidelity. Today's reading is best understood in the context of Exodus Chapter 32, Israel's sin of infidelity in making the "golden calf" to replace God. In anger, Moses breaks the stone tablets upon which the Ten Commandments were written. When Israel atones for this sin, Moses receives from God a new set of stone tablets of the Ten Commandments. In response, Moses bows down in worship to God, who forgives his people for their idolatry. In being given a second chance at receiving the Ten Commandments, Moses recognises God's mercy and fidelity to a sinful and "stiff-necked" people.

For nearly twelve-hundred years, from Moses to the Christ, Israel had God's Law, written in stone, by which the people of Israel could measure themselves in relation to God and to each other. In today's Gospel reading we learn that God fulfils his covenantal promise to Israel, no longer in stone, but now in the flesh and blood of his Son. It is not only God's mercy and fidelity to Israel that brings forth the Word made flesh; it is God's love: "For God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son."

In the Second Reading, from 2 Corinthians, we hear one of the clearest expressions of the Trinity in the New Testament: The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." Written within twenty years after the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus, Paul already saw the principal functions of the Trinity as grace, love and fellowship.

When questioned about the Trinity our instinct is perhaps to answer 'It's a mystery. We can't understand it'. While that is true, it doesn't mean we don't think about it. A mystery of faith is in some ways similar to the mystery of the universe. We plumb its depths. We look at it from different angles. We ask questions. We discuss. We debate. In the process we find that we have not exhausted the topic; rather it has exhausted us. So we return to it later and learning more with each engagement. Dismissing any consideration of the Trinity solely because it is a mystery does us a disservice as rational yet faith-filled Christians. Many theologians have sought to express various aspects of this ministry through the centuries, and many more will continue to do so into the future

Part of our living the mystery is to know that we will never fully comprehend or understand all of what it means for God to be a Trinity. In the same way, we will never fully comprehend or understand the entirety of the universe. But we can approach each mystery with humility and a sense of wonder and respect. Jesus is the God incarnate. He called God Father, and promised to send the Spirit who would remind his disciples about Jesus. Each of us has been baptised into the life of the Trinity and will continue to let that meaning


unfold each day of our ongoing lives.

As I write this, we are still waiting to hear from the government when it might be possible to re-open churches for individual prayer. As I wrote in the Newsletter last week, we are still some way off the time when we will be able to gather again for the public celebration of Mass. In the meantime we look forward to the day, hopefully relatively soon, when we can re-open Our Lady's for some times of individual prayer. As I explained previously, there is much to do even in preparation for this limited step. Next week the clergy of the Watford deanery will be meeting via 'Zoom' to discuss how we can work in a coordinated way to ensure, if possible, that at least one or two churches in the deanery are open each day for a period of individual prayer.

We will not be able to take the step of opening any church for individual prayer until after the government and the diocese have given us permission to do so. We will then be required to undertake a thorough risk-assessment, make sure that all health and safety and hygiene processes are in place, and have teams of volunteer stewards and cleaners ready to go. These things will take time, and so I ask for your patience, consideration and support as we cautiously move forward in a way that means we are doing everything we can to make it as safe as possible for people to spend some time in church for individual prayer.

On this Sunday of the Most Holy Trinity we place all our trust and hope in the God who has revealed himself to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit; praying that we may be filled with the grace, courage and strength to meet and overcome the challenges before us.

FEELING DISCONNECTED?

Are you feeling disconnected from parish life? Do you miss your community, and priests? We are missing you! Please, join us, and your parish community, in our new **online parish bible study programme and prayer (Lectio Divina) group**. The programme runs in two sessions each week. We invite you to attend both Sessions each week, but even if you can only attend one or the other, we hope that you will find it helpful in this time when we cannot gather physically as a Church community.

Online Bible Study programme – Monday evenings at 7.30pm

Session One each week we will take a look at short passage of scripture (from the Acts of the Apostles) and delve into its historical and biblical context, how it would have been understood by the Early Church, what it says about God, and what it has to say to us today. No previous experience of bible study is necessary. Fr Shaun will lead this via 'Zoom', following up-to-date security measures. It will last between 45 minutes to an hour. CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE - STICKERS

Parents who will be seeking a Certificate of Catholic Practice for September 2021 Catholic Secondary Transfer or a September 2021 place at a Catholic Nursery or in Reception year may be concerned about what will happen with regard to our sticker system during the suspension of the public celebration of Mass. **Please do not be anxious about this.** Each Sunday during the period of the suspension of the public celebration of Mass will be removed from our assessment of Sunday Mass attendance. We will only take account of the Sundays when Sunday Mass has been publically celebrated. This will mean that the suspension of Sunday Mass will have no effect upon the issuing of Certificates of Catholic Practice.
