### SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) – 19<sup>th</sup> JULY 2020

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

What is heaven like? Wouldn't we all like to know! So, it's not surprising that people asked Jesus this question. But instead of telling them about harps, clouds, and pearly gates, he told them about seeds. It's true that the Kingdom of Heaven is the hope of eternal life, but according to Jesus, the Kingdom of Heaven is not only something in our future. It's here already, planted like a seed in the hearts of those who believe, and in the Church. It may be hidden, like seed under the soil or yeast folded into dough, but it is here, nevertheless. And Jesus promised that what is now concealed will someday be revealed.

The time we live in is a waiting between Jesus' first coming and his return. But during that time, those who follow Jesus are expected to do some things. We continue the work of Jesus by spreading the seeds of the Kingdom. When we love our neighbour, when we find feed the hungry, when we talk about our faith with others, we are planting seeds.

But there is one thing we are not to do, and that is judge others. That means that we are not allowed to try to determine who are the "wheat" and who are the "weeds" (darnel). As the First Reading for today says, we are to treat

others with leniency and kindness. The psalm reminds us to forgive. In fact, forgiving others is another way to plant the seeds of the Kingdom. Judgement is God's job, and even he is not doing it because there is still time for conversion – as long as one is alive, there is still time to turn to God. What we are required to do is to keep spreading those seeds.

Last Sunday, for the first time in four months, we were able to celebrate a public Mass at Our Lady's. It was a real joy to see nearly 40 parishioners sharing with us in the celebration of Mass and able to receive Holy Communion after such an extended period without being able to do so.

I am extremely grateful to everyone who has worked so closely with Fr Damian and me to get us to this stage. I am particularly grateful to the members of the Senior Leadership Team for their important guidance, advice and hard work. I express my thanks, too, to Mike Quinn who has done so much work behind the scenes to help ensure that Our Lady's is a COVID-19 safe environment. Nor can I fail to mention the generosity of all of those parishioners who have volunteered to serve as stewards and cleaners – without their commitment we wouldn't be able to open the church at all.

We have been continuing to build and consolidate our teams of volunteer stewards and cleaners, and I am delighted to say that **from Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> July (inclusive)** we are able to add a **Sunday 6.00pm Mass** to our


Mass schedule at Our Lady's. Later this week there will be online options to book either for the Sunday 10.00am Mass or for the Sunday 6.00pm Mass. As I have previously explained, taskforces for St John Fisher, Chorleywood and St John's, Mil End are looking into the feasibility of re-opening those churches for Mass from mid-September. Details of how to book online for Mass are available further down the Newsletter.

To ensure everyone's safety, the number able to attend Mass is limited, in line with social distancing requirements. We, therefore, ask for your continued patience if you are not able to secure a place at Mass as quickly as you had hoped. We are asking those who have been successful not to try to book again for about four weeks, so that others may have the opportunity of physically attending Mass.

Later this month I will be meeting with the Finance Operations and Premises Committees of the three parishes to discuss the possibility of installing a professional live-streaming service at Our Lady's, with the costs being shared fairly between three parishes. The costs involved are significant and there are other factors which will need to be carefully considered. I will let you know the outcome of these discussions as soon as a decision has been made.

Please continue to pray for Fr Damian and me and all working with us as, step by step, we move to re-open our churches for the celebration of Mass. The issues are often complex and need careful consideration and planning. Please remember too that our first priority in all of this is the safety of everyone who enters our churches.

## THE BOOKING OF MASSES

Currently we are celebrating one Sunday Mass at Our Lady's at 10am and **from 26<sup>th</sup> July** – one Sunday 6.00pm Mass. Places are limited and so you are invited to book online via the **EVENTS** page of Our Lady's website. Please note that you are booking **A PEW** not individual seats. Please read the instructions on the booking page carefully and provide all the information requested. If you successfully book a pew we ask that, out of courtesy to others, you do not book again for at least three weeks. If you know of a parishioner who does not have internet access but wishes to attend a Mass, please do let us know so that we can arrange this. So that the stewards can seat you safely we ask that you please arrive **no earlier than 20 minutes and no later than 5 minutes before the time the Mass is due to start.** **Government Advisory:** Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID19, including people aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions. Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household. Shielded patients are currently advised not to meet more than one person from outside of their own household, and therefore not currently advised to attend places of worship.

## CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE – ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22 – UPDATED INFORMATION

I have decided that no further stickers will be given out for those applying for a place in a Catholic School for the academic year 2021/22. The assessment of whether a CCP can be issued will now be made in the following ways:

**Secondary Transfer:** Only the Sundays from the **beginning of October 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Further, given the unprecedented nature of the situation, I will be reducing the requirement from 70% attendance to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **16** out of a possible **24** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In September 2020, I will set out the arrangements for the signing of CCPs in October 2020.

**Nursery/Reception** (*this does not include St John's school, Mill End, where a CCP is no longer a requirement*): Only the Sundays from the **beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Again, the requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **10** out of a possible **15** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In November 2020, I will set out arrangements for the signing of CCPs in November 2020.
