### EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) – 2<sup>ND</sup> AUGUST 2020

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

The feeding of the multitudes is the only miracle of Jesus that is recorded in all four accounts of the Gospel, so it must have been extremely important to the first Christians. Jesus' acts of feeding have been seen as pivotal works that reminded believers how God had provided bread for the people in the wilderness (Exodus 16), and it also foreshadowed the heavenly banquet in Jesus' description of the Kingdom (Matthew 22). The feeding of the multitudes also became a symbol for the Eucharist in the early Church, and paintings of baskets of bread and fish are common in the catacombs where the early Christians buried their loved ones, because the Eucharist was understood as the "food of eternal life"

In this miracle, Jesus was teaching his followers a lesson that he explained further in his Bread of Life discourse (John 6). The point is that God has provided us with what we need most – Jesus himself is the bread of life. The Old Testament readings emphasize that the things we eat and drink, and the things we spend our money on, can never really satisfy us. But God, in his compassion for us, offers what we really need – his love and forgiveness – all without price. We just have to accept it from him. This comes to us in the person of Jesus Christ, who is God in the flesh (John 1:14). So how do we accept God's gift of love and forgiveness? The Lord "*is close to all who call him*", says the psalmist in today's responsorial psalm. The most important way we call on him is by participating in the Eucharist, where we become like the five thousand families that Jesus fed.

A consequence of months of lockdown is that you have been deprived of the opportunity to receive the Lord in Holy Communion. Now that the public celebration of Mass has resumed some of you have been able to receive the Eucharist again and I know that this has been a great joy to those of you who have. I am conscious though, that many of you have not yet had the opportunity to do so. I hope that in the coming weeks and months more and more of you will be able to attend Mass and receive the Lord, and all that he wants to share with you, in Holy Communion. God cares for us with a love that will never end and when we are fed by Christ, then nothing can separate us from his love.

I'm delighted to report that the work of the St John Fisher and St John the Evangelist taskforces progressing very well. There is still much to do but we are well on course to re-open both of these churches for the celebration of a Sunday Mass each week, commencing on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> September. I am very grateful to the taskforces for all that they have done and are continuing to do to make sure that our churches are COVID safe environments.

Last Sunday afternoon there was a joint meeting of the Finance, Operations and Premises (FOP) Committees of the three parishes to discuss the proposal that we invest in installing professional livestreaming at Our Lady's, with the costs being shared on a *per capita* basis between the three parishes. I am delighted to be able to share with you the news that the three FOP committees have agreed to this proposal. It is our hope that the livestreaming equipment will be installed for the beginning of September.


As you will appreciate, the costs of installing livestreaming equipment and buying into a professional livestreaming service are significant. The installation costs of the system £5,804 including VAT and the per annum livestreaming fees are around £1,600 (including VAT). The FOP committee members of the three parishes, although very much in

favour of us proceeding with a livestreaming service, are also very conscious that at this time our parish finances are under considerable pressure. We are currently almost entirely dependent on parishioners who support the parishes via standing order contributions.

Consequently, the three FOPs have asked that we initiate a three-parish fundraising appeal to try to cover some of the costs of the installation of the livestreaming equipment. We are therefore inviting parishioners who wish to do so, and only those who are able to, to make a donation towards this project. I know that the livestreaming of Mass has been a lifeline for many of you. As it is likely to be some considerable time before social distancing requirements are removed, going forward we hope that many of you would value the opportunity of being able to share in the celebration of Mass via livestreaming from within our own family of parishes for those times when you are not able to attend in person. If you would like to make a donation towards the cost of the installation of the livestreaming equipment, you will find details of how to do this further down this newsletter.

It is my view that the ability of livestream Masses from Our Lady's will have long-term benefits for all of our parishioners – for times when due to sickness or bad weather people are unable to attend Mass and for distant family members wishing to share in important celebrations such as baptisms, first communions, confirmations, weddings and funerals. This is an exciting development with a great deal of potential.

## FACE COVERINGS AT MASS

The government has announced that from Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> August it will be mandatory to wear a face covering in places of worship. If you are attending Mass from next weekend onwards we kindly ask you to please bring a face covering with you.

## THE BOOKING OF MASSES

Currently we are celebrating one Sunday Masses at Our Lady's at 10am and 6.00pm (Sunday evening). Places are limited and so you are invited to book online via the **EVENTS** page of Our Lady's website. Please note that you are booking **A PEW** not individual seats. Please read the instructions on the booking page carefully and provide all the information requested. If you successfully book a pew we ask that, out of courtesy to others, you do not book again for at least three weeks. If you know of a parishioner who does not have internet access but wishes to attend a Mass, please do let us know so that we can arrange this. So that the stewards can seat you safely we ask that you please arrive **no earlier than 20 minutes and no later than 5 minutes before the time the Mass is due to start.** **Government Advisory:** Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID19, including people aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions. Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household. Shielded patients are currently advised not to meet more than one person from outside of their own household, and therefore not currently advised to attend places of worship.

## **CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE – ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22 – UPDATED INFORMATION**

I have decided that no further stickers will be given out for those applying for a place in a Catholic School for the academic year 2021/22. The assessment of whether a CCP can be issued will now be made in the following ways:

**Secondary Transfer:** Only the Sundays from the **beginning of October 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Further, given the unprecedented nature of the situation, I will be reducing the requirement from 70% attendance to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **16** out of a possible **24** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In September 2020, I will set out the arrangements for the signing of CCPs in October 2020.

**Nursery/Reception** (*this does not include St John's school, Mill End, where a CCP is no longer a requirement*): Only the Sundays from the **beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Again, the requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **10** out of a possible **15** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In November 2020, I will set out arrangements for the signing of CCPs in November 2020.
