NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) – 9th AUGUST 2020

A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

When we read today's Gospel, we tend to focus on the fact that Jesus walked on the water, which is understandable. But before we jump to that, let's not forget to notice why Jesus wasn't in the boat in the first place. He went off to be alone and to pray. If Jesus needed to pray, how much more do we!

Jesus seemed to expect Peter to walk on water – and he did for a second. Apparently, walking on water doesn't require divinity! In fact, Jesus said we could do the things he did (John 14:12). But Peter started to sink because he was afraid. Fear is the opposite of faith. Prayer builds faith and reduces fear by increasing our trust in God. The more we pray, the less we fear. Peter is an example of our imperfect faith (he even denied he knew Jesus), but he's also an example for us to follow. When he was sinking, he put his trust in Jesus and called out to him. When we put our trust in Jesus to save us, he holds us up, and he sustains us through our most difficult times.

One of the early symbols for the Church was a boat. The Church was seen as a small boat tossed around in an unfriendly sea (a world that persecuted Christians). But the presence of Jesus in the boat calms the storm, and

pulls us up when we call and put our trust in him. Fear can seize us without warning, but we will be better prepared for it if we follow Jesus' example of making time for prayer.

I hope that all of you may have an opportunity for some time of rest and refreshment during August, even if it has to be a "staycation" or some local relaxation with family and friends. We know that the autumn will hold challenges for all of us. It seems likely that coronavirus is going to be a challenging reality in our lives for some considerable time to come and this will inevitably have many different impacts on the way we do things in our parishes. Once again, I ask for your patience and consideration. Be assured that our first priority will always be your safety.

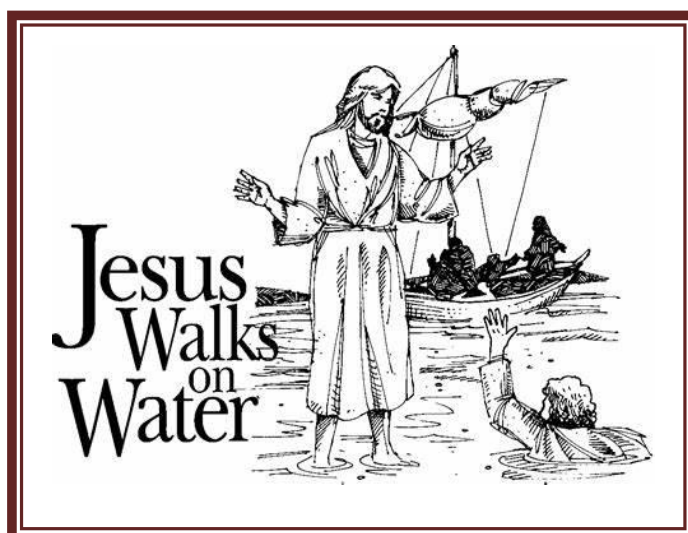

FACE COVERINGS AT MASS

It is now mandatory to wear a face covering in places of worship. If you are attending Mass we kindly ask you to please bring a face covering with you.

THE BOOKING OF MASSES

Currently we are celebrating one Sunday Masses at Our Lady's at 10am and 6.00pm (Sunday evening). Places are limited and so you are invited to book online via the **EVENTS** page of Our Lady's website. Please note that you are booking **A PEW** not individual seats. Please read the instructions on the booking page carefully and provide all the information requested. If you successfully book a pew we ask that, out of courtesy to others, you do not book again until late in the week. If places are available at either Mass from Thursday onwards you are welcome to book again, even if you have attended in the past few weeks. If you know of a parishioner who does not have internet access but wishes to attend a Mass, please do let us know so that we can arrange this. So that the stewards can seat you safely we ask that you please arrive **no earlier than 20 minutes and no later than 5 minutes before the time the Mass is due to start. Government Advisory:** Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID19, including people aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions. Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household.

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE – ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22 – UPDATED INFORMATION

I have decided that no further stickers will be given out for those applying for a place in a Catholic School for the academic year 2021/22. The assessment of whether a CCP can be issued will now be made in the following ways:

Secondary Transfer: Only the Sundays from the **beginning of October 2019 until and including Sunday 15th March 2020** will be assessed. Further, given the unprecedented nature of the situation, I will be reducing the requirement from 70% attendance to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **16** out of a possible **24** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In September 2020, I will set out the arrangements for the signing of CCPs in October 2020.

Nursery/Reception (*this does not include St John's school, Mill End, where a CCP is no longer a requirement*): Only the Sundays from the **beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15th March 2020** will be assessed. Again, the requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **10** out of a possible **15** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In November 2020, I will set out arrangements for the signing of CCPs in November 2020.
