### TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) – 23rd AUGUST 2020

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN

It seems strange that Jesus would tell his disciples not to reveal that he was the Christ (the Messiah). After all, isn't that the point? But the problem was that many people of the time had different ideas about what the Messiah was supposed to be. So Jesus spent a lot of time trying to persuade people to rethink the whole concept of Messiah. Most people thought (or feared) that the Messiah was going to be a warrior who would restore the dynasty of King David over Israel.

Jesus had to redefine Messiah for them in light of the prophecies of Isaiah chapter 53, concerning the one who suffers for others. Jesus would achieve victory through suffering. Until people understood that, he could not risk a misunderstanding. Peter had a partial understanding, though not through his own insight. It was revealed to him by God. And so in this passage we see the twofold foundation of the Church: Scripture (revelation from God) and Tradition (personified in the Apostles and especially Peter).

Most Catholics are familiar with this Gospel passage as the moment when Jesus makes Peter the first leader of the Apostles, giving him authority, which is symbolized by the image of the keys. But there is something else equally important here. Jesus made a promise to Peter and the other Apostles that the Church will be built on a rock and the gates of the underworld will not hold out

against it. The 'gates of the underworld' is a metaphor for death and so these gates represent the imprisoning power of death: Jesus is saying that death will not be able to imprison and hold the Church of the living God. Death will be unable to swallow up the new community which Jesus is building. It will never be destroyed. The Church will never cease being the Church, and so the authority given to Peter and the Apostles came with a promise that we can trust them and their successors to help us understand who Jesus is, and how to live as his missionary disciples.

As I write this, on Thursday, the work of installing the livestreaming equipment at Our Lady's has begun. This is a relatively complex procedure as the system has to be connected to the internet router in the presbytery via wiring. We will begin livestreaming Mass as soon as the system is working and has been integrated with our website, so that parishioners have easy access to it. I am delighted to say that we are very close to our target of raising the £6,000 cost of the installation of the livestreaming equipment. I wish to express my sincere thanks to all of those who have so generously contributed to this project. If you haven't yet contributed, but would like to, it's not too late. Details of how to do so are further down this newsletter. Any funds we raise over and above the cost of the initial installation will be specifically allocated towards the monthly streaming costs associated with the livestreaming contract.

From conversations I have had over the past few weeks, I know that many parishioners across the three parishes are very enthusiastic about our ability to be able to livestream Mass. Whilst there are no shortage of churches offering a livestream service, there is a great deal of merit in us having this facility in our parishes. The social

distancing restrictions associated with COVID19 are likely to be a reality in our lives for some time to come and even with the reopening of St John Fisher and St John the Evangelist on 13<sup>th</sup> September, it will still not be possible for every parishioner to attend Mass every week. We are a community of three parishes and I believe that this livestreaming service will play an important part in keeping us united in the challenging months ahead.

## **THE BOOKING OF MASSES**

Currently we are celebrating one Sunday Masses at Our Lady's at 10am and 6.00pm (Sunday evening). Places are limited and so you are invited to book online via the **EVENTS** page of Our Lady's website. Please note that you are booking **A PEW** not individual seats. Please read the instructions on the booking page carefully and provide all the information requested. If you successfully book a pew we ask that, out of courtesy to others, you do not book again until late in the week. If places are available at either Mass from Thursday onwards you are welcome to book again, even if you have attended in the past few weeks. If you know of a parishioner who does not have internet access but wishes to attend a Mass, please do let us know so that we can arrange this. So that the stewards can seat you safely we ask that you please arrive **no earlier than 20 minutes and no later than 5 minutes before the time the Mass is due to start. Government Advisory:** Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID19, including people aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions. Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household. **It is now mandatory to wear a face covering in places of worship.** We kindly ask you to please bring a face covering with you.

## CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE – ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22 – UPDATED INFORMATION

I have decided that no further stickers will be given out for those applying for a place in a Catholic School for the academic year 2021/22. The assessment of whether a CCP can be issued will now be made in the following ways:

**Secondary Transfer:** Only the Sundays from the **beginning of October 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Further, given the unprecedented nature of the situation, I will be reducing the requirement from 70% attendance to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **16** out of a possible **24** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In September 2020, I will set out the arrangements for the signing of CCPs in October 2020.

**Nursery/Reception** (*this does not include St John's school, Mill End, where a CCP is no longer a requirement*): Only the Sundays from the **beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Again, the requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **10** out of a possible **15** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In November 2020, I will set out arrangements for the signing of CCPs in November 2020.
