TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 13TH SEPTEMBER 2020

SUNDAY THOUGHT

Earlier in the Gospel according to Matthew, when Jesus taught the Our Father, he emphasised forgiveness, saying: “if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your failings either.” These are strong words, which imply that our forgiveness is dependent on our willingness to forgive others.

Today’s parable of the unmerciful servant illustrates this point with a story of someone who refused to forgive, and his forgiveness was taken away. Clearly this is an analogy in which the master represents God, and the servants represent people like us, who are supposed to treat each other the way God treats us – with forgiveness. The First Reading puts it well: “If a man nurses anger against another, can he then demand compassion from the Lord?” God has forgiven us so much, and God is willing to go on forgiving us - but if we will not forgive others we are throwing God’s gift of forgiveness back in his face. The refusal to forgive is itself a sin that needs forgiveness. When we refuse to forgive, we cut ourselves off from God’s forgiveness.

When we are hurt by someone, we may need a little time to take stock of our feelings, but ultimately it is most helpful to take a position of humility – a position that refuses to judge, refuses to adopt a self-righteous attitude, and refuses to hold a grudge. A grudge is like toxic waste; it hurts the one who holds it. So how many times should we forgive the person who wrongs us? When Jesus says seventy-seven times, he really means stop counting. Forgive as many times as it takes.

This weekend we re-commence the celebration of Mass at St John Fisher, Chorleywood and St John the Evangelist, Mill End. I wish to express my sincere thanks to the task-forces of these two parishes (Chorleywood: Alan and Carolyn Opie, Anne Lorrimer-Roberts and Maggie Stacey) (Mill End: Bo Bambridge, Geraldine Page, Sandra Miller and Maria Crossland) for the immense amount of work that they have all put into preparing for this day and making sure that we can re-open these churches, in a sustainable and COVID secure way.

I look forward very much to celebrating Mass this weekend in both of these parishes.

WEEKDAY MASSES AT OUR LADY'S

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE – ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22 – UPDATED INFORMATION

The assessment of whether a CCP can be issued will be made in the following way:

Secondary Transfer: Only the Sundays from the **beginning of October 2019 until and including Sunday 15th March 2020** will be assessed. Further, given the unprecedented nature of the situation, I will be reducing the requirement from 70% attendance to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **16** out of a possible **24** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. Fr Shaun will be available to sign CCPs at the following times in the parish hall:

Monday 5th October: 5.00pm – 6.00pm

Wednesday 7th October: 6.00pm – 7.00pm

Saturday 10th October: 11.00am to 12 noon

You will need to book a specific (5 minute) appointment time by calling Kerry, our Parish Administrator, on 01923 773387 Ext 2, between 9.30am and 3.00pm Monday to Friday. Only one parent (no children) should attend the appointment. Please arrive 5 minutes before your appointment time and remember to bring your sticker card with you.

Nursery/Reception (*this does not include St John's school, Mill End, where a CCP is no longer a requirement*): Only the Sundays from the **beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15th March 2020** will be assessed. Again, the requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **10** out of a possible **15** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In November 2020, I will set out arrangements for the signing of CCPs in November 2020. *Fr Shaun.*

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2021

Due to the pandemic, the preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion for 2021 will not commence until **January 2021**. Registration will take place in November 2020. Details of the programme have yet to be finalized, but is almost certain that the format will be remote sessions (via Zoom) for the children and parent(s) together.
