TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 18TH OCTOBER 2020

SUNDAY THOUGHT

Initially, today's First Reading may take us by surprise. Cyrus? The Lord's anointed? Cyrus was the Persian king who conquered Babylon during the exile, thus winning freedom for the Jewish people. Isaiah speaks of him as the Lord's "anointed" (literally, messiah), the agent God used on behalf of his chosen people even though Cyrus did not "know" God – that is, was not in a covenant relationship with him as a member of the chosen people.

The books of Ezra and Nehemiah recount the Jews' return to Jerusalem and rebuilding of the Temple and city, showing how the people appropriately "repaid" both God and government their respective dues. There was no doubt, however, that God was God and that no other ruler was more supreme.

In today's Gospel reading, the conflict between Jesus and the Jewish leaders continues. Today the Pharisees are in the spotlight. Enlisting the aid of the Herodians, who were supporters of the ruling dynasty of Herod the Great and thus loyal to Rome, the Pharisees are trying to put allegiance to the government in conflict with the covenant ("lawful") fidelity to God. In effect, the Pharisees are playing both sides in order to trap Jesus. In response, Jesus affirms the just claim of both, "Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God."

What belongs to God is, of course, everything and everyone. How fittingly today's Responsorial Psalm acclaims "Give the Lord glory and power ... the gods of the heathens are naught ... God is king." Let us pray, this day, for a heightened awareness that all belongs to God. Let us give the tribute that is rightly due.

WEEKDAY MASS AND VOLUNTEERS

We are now celebrating public Masses at **Our Lady's** on **Wednesdays** and **Fridays, 9.30am**. There is no online booking, but attendance is on a first-come first-serve basis. Be aware that if there are funerals or memorial services on Wednesdays and Fridays, public Mass will be cancelled. However, information about cancellations will be given as soon as possible.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION)

Although it isn't currently possible for the priests to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the confessional, both Fr Damian and I are available for the celebration of the sacrament by individual appointment. The celebration would take place, outside of Mass time, either in the garden (weather permitting) or in an empty church. Any parishioners wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation should contact either Fr Damian or me to arrange a mutually convenient time.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - MASS ATTENDANCE STICKERS AND CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) OF 2022 SECONDARY TRANSFER

With the Sunday Mass Obligation currently suspended and the ability of families to attend Mass in the parish each Sunday being very restricted due to social distancing measures, it is currently not possible to provide Mass attendance cards and stickers to families with a child making secondary transfer in 2022. There currently seems to be a level of uncertainty about if, and on what criteria, priests are going to be asked to complete CCPs for 2022 Secondary admissions. For the time being, all parents with a child who will be seeking a place in a Catholic Secondary school in 2022 should email me at shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk, providing the following information:

- Name of the child (first name and surname)
- Parents/Guardians names (first name and surname)
- Address at which you reside
- Telephone contact details

I will retain this information and keep a careful eye on Diocesan guidance with regard to the issuing of CCPs for 2022 transfer in the light of the prevailing restrictions caused by the pandemic. *Fr Shaun*

HEATING THE CHURCH

With the onset of autumn and colder days, our expectation is that our churches will soon be heated. Every parish currently has to make thoughtful decisions about how to heat their churches whilst at the same time ensuring good ventilation as a part of our COVID secure measures. However, we have a particular problem at St John's, Mill End, in that our heating system is a fan-blower system which recirculates the heated air throughout the church. We have, therefore, been advised by the Diocese to heat the church prior to opening the church and then turn the heating off once people begin to arrive. This will mean that the church will be not be "toastily" warm during Mass, though hopefully it will retain some of the heat. As the days get colder, we encourage you to come to Mass prepared – i.e. lots of warm layers. If you are someone who feels the cold very strongly, you might wish to book a place at Mass at Our Lady's, rather than at St John's, at least when the winter is as its coldest.
