### TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 4<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2020

### SUNDAY THOUGHT

‘The vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel’ says Isaiah toward the end of today’s First Reading. There can be no doubt that Matthew also speaks of the vineyard of the house of Israel in the Gospel for this Sunday. Matthew’s focus, however, isn’t so much the vineyard, which becomes the Kingdom of God at the end of the reading, but rather, its tenants. The Lectionary omits a later verse, which clearly identifies the chief priests and scribes with the tenants. In the course of Matthew’s account of the Gospel, the Jewish leaders’ opposition to Jesus steadily increased and culminated in Jesus’ death. It is to them that the parable is addressed.

In the Gospel today, the chief priests and scribes pronounce judgement on themselves. But later in chapter 23, Jesus will pronounce judgement on the Jewish leaders, the wretched tenants of God’s vineyard. Like the tenants in the parable, the Jewish leaders rejected and killed the Son. Matthew, ever ready to present Jesus as the fulfilment of the Old Testament, portrays him drawing on a verse from Psalm 118 to demonstrate the triumph of God’s plan: ‘It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone.’ The keystone is a stone at the centre of an arch which holds the structure together. The early Christians especially loved this text as a description of Jesus (Acts 4:11; 1 Peter 2:7), and it expresses their understanding of themselves as a building built and supported on him.

Today’s readings call us to examine ourselves. What kind of tenants are we? May we never be found negligent.


### THE RECOMMENCEMENT OF WEEKDAY MASS AND VOLUNTEERS

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION - MASS ATTENDANCE STICKERS AND CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) OF 2022 SECONDARY TRANSFER

With the Sunday Mass Obligation currently suspended and the ability of families to attend Mass in the parish each Sunday being very restricted due to social distancing measures, it is currently not possible to provide Mass attendance cards and stickers to families with a child making secondary transfer in 2022. There currently seems to be a level of uncertainty about if, and on what criteria, priests are going to be asked to complete CCPs for 2022 Secondary admissions. For the time being, all parents with a child who will be seeking a place in a Catholic Secondary school in 2022 should email me at [shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk](mailto:shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk), providing the following information:

- Name of the child (first name and surname)
- Parents/Guardians names (first name and surname)
- Address at which you reside
- Telephone contact details

I will retain this information and keep a careful eye on Diocesan guidance with regard to the issuing of CCPs for 2022 transfer in the light of the prevailing restrictions caused by the pandemic. *Fr Shaun*

### CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE – ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22 – UPDATED INFORMATION

The assessment of whether a CCP can be issued will be made in the following way:

**Secondary Transfer:** Only the Sundays from the **beginning of October 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Further, given the unprecedented nature of the situation, I will be reducing the requirement from 70% attendance to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **16** out of a possible **24** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. Fr Shaun will be available to sign CCPs at the following times in the parish hall:

**Monday 5<sup>th</sup> October: 5pm – 6pm; Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> October: 6pm – 7pm; Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> October: 11am to 12 noon.**

You will need to book a specific (5 minute) appointment time by calling Kerry, our Parish Administrator, on 01923 773387 Ext 2, between 9.30am and 3.00pm Monday to Friday. Only one parent (no children) should attend the appointment. Please arrive five minutes before your appointment time **wearing a face mask/covering**, and remember to bring your sticker card with you.

**Nursery/Reception (this does not include St John's school, Mill End, where a CCP is no longer a requirement):** Only the Sundays from the **beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020** will be assessed. Again, the requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need **10** out of a possible **15** stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. In November 2020, I will set out arrangements for the signing of CCPs in November 2020. *Fr Shaun.*

### HEATING THE CHURCH

With the onset of autumn and colder days, our expectation is that our churches will soon be heated. Every parish currently has to make thoughtful decisions about how to heat their churches whilst at the same time ensuring good ventilation as a part of our COVID secure measures. However, we have a particular problem at St John's, Mill End, in that our heating system is a fan-blower system which recirculates the heated air throughout the church. We have, therefore, been advised by the Diocese to heat the church prior to opening the church and then turn the heating off once people begin to arrive. This will mean that the church will be not be "toastily" warm during Mass, though hopefully it will retain some of the heat. As the days get colder, we encourage you to come to Mass prepared – i.e. lots of warm layers. If you are someone who feels the cold very strongly, you might wish to book a place at Mass at Our Lady's, rather than at St John's, at least when the winter is at its coldest.
