### OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE 22<sup>ND</sup> NOVEMBER 2020

#### SUNDAY THOUGHT

In the Gospel for today's solemnity, Jesus (the Son of Man) is depicted as the shepherd-king of the entire universe. His flock includes absolutely everyone, and his criterion of judgment has to do with nothing other than the well-being of the flock. What the shepherd-king expects of his creatures are the simplest, most fundamental services possible. They involve responses to the most basic human needs: food and water, clothing and shelter, and care for the incapacitated.

Jesus speaks of himself as the shepherd assigned by God at the end of time to judge all people and lead his sheep into the Kingdom of heaven. Like Ezekiel, Jesus makes it clear that those who reach out to the most vulnerable in society (the hungry, the naked, the sick and the prisoner) will be the sheep on his right who are led into the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus declares that his concern for the vulnerable is such that he identifies intimately with them. He suffers with them and is served in them. Taken together, our readings today unflinchingly remind us that if we want to share in the Kingdom of the divine shepherd, we need to seek and serve him serving the needy.

Together, in faith and love, we offer the sacrifice of our lives, united with Christ's self-opening to receive the Father's love. May we live in such a way that our openness to God becomes so compelling that it brings unity and peace to the entire world.

## NOTICES FOR ALL THREE PARISHES

### UPDATED - IMPORTANT INFORMATION - MASS ATTENDANCE STICKERS AND CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) OF 2022 SECONDARY TRANSFER AND NURSERY / RECEPTION 2022

With the Sunday Mass Obligation currently suspended and the ability of families to attend Mass in the parish each Sunday being very restricted due to social distancing measures, it is currently not possible to provide Mass attendance cards and stickers to families with a child making secondary transfer in 2022 or seeking a nursery or reception place in a Catholic primary school in 2022. There currently seems to be a level of uncertainty about if, and on what criteria, priests are going to be asked to complete CCPs for 2022 admissions. For the time being, all parents with a child who will be seeking a place in a Catholic Secondary school in 2022 or a nursery or reception place in a Catholic primary school (other than St John's, Mill End or St Anthony's, Watford which do not require a CCP) should email me at [shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk](mailto:shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk), providing the following information:

- Name of the child (first name and surname)
- Parents/Guardians names (first name and surname)
- Address at which you reside
- Telephone contact details

I will retain this information and keep a careful eye on Diocesan guidance with regard to the issuing of CCPs for 2022 admissions in the light of the prevailing restrictions caused by the pandemic. *Fr Shaun*

### CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) - Nursery/Reception - Academic Year 2021/22

The assessment of whether a CCP for a Nursery/Reception place at a Catholic Primary School for the academic year 2021/22 can be issued will be made in the following way: Only the Sundays from the beginning of December 2019 until and including Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020 will be assessed. The requirement of 70% attendance will be reduced to 65% attendance. This will mean that you will need 10 out of a possible 15 stickers in order for a CCP to be issued. If you are only applying for place at St John's School, Mill End and/or St Anthony's School, Watford, you do not need a CCP, as these schools have removed the need for a CCP from their admissions criteria. Fr Shaun will be available to sign CCPs on **Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> November** from 11.00am to 11.30am. You will need to book a specific (5 minute) appointment time by calling Kerry, our Parish Administrator, on 01923 773387 Ext 2, between 9.30am and 3.00pm Monday to Friday. Only one parent (no children) should attend the appointment. Please arrive 5 minutes before your appointment time and remember to bring your sticker card with you. Please wear a face covering. Thank you.
