### THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT (YEAR B) - 13<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2020 GAUDETE SUNDAY

#### SUNDAY THOUGHT

On this 'Gaudete' (Rejoice) Sunday, other readings, and the gospel acclamation may speak more directly of joy or glad tidings than the gospel, which gives us its version of the story of John. Of course, he is often referred to as John the Baptist in Matthew, Mark and Luke but not in this gospel. Here he is clearly and simply called a 'man' and when he is named, it is merely 'John' without modifier. In this way, and in many others in this gospel, he is distinguished from Jesus.

The Fourth Gospel states clearly and unequivocally that John was not the light, but was sent from God to testify to the light. John admits that he is not the Messiah; he is not Elijah. In the Fourth Gospel John is not even the prophet. His role is to cry out in the desert 'Make a straight way for the Lord'. Such a deflection away from any attention or claims to himself seems to reflect the interests of the evangelist more than the historical situation of his time. Indeed, there are other clues in the Fourth Gospel and other New Testament writings that tell us that John continued to have a following years, even decades, after his death. Today, we recognise that John prepared the way for Jesus.

This first chapter of the Fourth Gospel reminded the early Christian community that John was merely a precursor, a forerunner, to Jesus the Messiah. We have heard these stories so often, and frequently from the point of view of Matthew, Mark and Luke. When we read John's Gospel on its own terms we see that John says he baptises with water. We might expect him to say, 'but the one coming after me will baptise with the Holy Spirit' as we hear in the other gospels. Instead John says 'I baptise with water, but there stands among you – unknown to you....'. There is nothing in this gospel about Jesus baptising with the Holy Spirit. Instead Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Even the use of the term sin in the singular rather than the plural is deliberate. Rather than merely taking away individual sins, Jesus takes away the cosmic force of sin. The Fourth Gospel reflects a different but congruent theological thought-world than the other gospels. The differences in details may seem minute but they point to profound theological emphases. Once John points the way to Jesus, once he testifies to the Lamb of God, John in effect disappears from the gospel (beyond some minor passing references). His role is basically confined to Chapter 1 of John's Gospel, and it consists in testifying to Jesus.

When we see how John gave testimony to Jesus we recognise him as a model for ourselves. John is not the centre of attention. When he receives attention he deflects it to Jesus. John will not even claim the title of prophet. He is merely a pointer to Jesus. After accomplishing his role John recedes into the background so that the one who is already in their midst might be made more fully known. Where do we find Jesus in our midst? Are we pointing to that reality, and testifying to it. Once having done so, do we then recede into the background?

### COVID19 VACCINES

In September 2020 the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales issued a statement COVID-19 and Vaccination (24<sup>th</sup> September 2020). In the light of the recent breakthrough in vaccine development the Bishop's Conference has now issued a follow up statement. The development of a vaccine against COVID-19 presents an important breakthrough in protecting others as well as oneself from the virus; a virus which has not only caused a global pandemic and led to a huge loss of life but has also placed a great burden on healthcare workers and systems. Each of us has a duty to protect others from infection with its danger of serious illness, and for some, death. A vaccine is the most effective way to achieve this unless one decides to self-isolate. At present, debate concerns the use of the vaccines developed by Pfizer & BioNTech, Moderna, and Astra Zeneca. Some have questioned the use of the Astra Zeneca vaccine since it has been developed from cell-lines originating from the cells of an aborted foetus in 1983. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the Pontifical Academy of Life have expressed the view that one may in good conscience and for a grave reason receive a vaccine sourced in this way, provided that there is a sufficient moral distance between the present administration of the vaccine and the original wrongful action. **In the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bishops' Conference has judged that this grave reason exists and that one does not sin by receiving the vaccine.** Both the Pfizer & BioNTech and Moderna vaccines have a different source since they are mRNA-based vaccines. On 2 December 2020, the Pfizer & BioNTech vaccine was approved for use in the UK. Each Catholic must educate his or her conscience on this matter and decide what to do, also bearing in mind that a vaccine must be safe, effective, and universally available, especially to the poor of the world. Catholics may in good conscience receive any of these vaccines for the good of others and themselves. In good conscience, one may refuse a particular vaccine but continues to have a duty to protect others from infection.

### UPDATED - IMPORTANT INFORMATION - MASS ATTENDANCE STICKERS AND CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) OF 2022 SECONDARY TRANSFER AND NURSERY / RECEPTION 2022

With the Sunday Mass Obligation currently suspended and the ability of families to attend Mass in the parish each Sunday being very restricted due to social distancing measures, it is currently not possible to provide Mass attendance cards and stickers to families with a child making secondary transfer in 2022 or seeking a nursery or reception place in a catholic primary school in 2022. There currently seems to be a level of uncertainty about if, and on what criteria, priests are going to be asked to complete CCPs for 2022 admissions. For the time being, all parents with a child who will be seeking a place in a Catholic Secondary school in 2022 or a nursery or reception place in a Catholic primary school (other than St John's, Mill End or St Anthony's, Watford which do not require a CCP) should email me at [shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk](mailto:shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk), providing the following information:
