FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT LAETARE SUNDAY (YEAR B) - 14TH MARCH 2021

SUNDAY THOUGHT

This Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called ‘Laetare Sunday’, from the Latin ‘to rejoice’ or ‘to be joyful’. It might seem a little odd to ‘rejoice’ in Lent but that exhortation is a reminder or rather a foreshadowing of Easter. It is as though Easter itself is breaking into the Lenten season this Sunday.

The Gospel today contains the famous verse: *Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life* (John 3:16). But prior to that verse we hear Jesus tell Nicodemus that the Son of Man must be lifted up (crucified). Only by means of his death is eternal life opened. For the Gospel of John, Jesus on the cross is a moment of glory, almost devoid of specific suffering.

Ultimately, John does not focus on Jesus’s pain. Instead, the cross is glory and the path to eternal life. As we journey through Lent, it might be fruitful for us to focus on Jesus and our belief in him. He represents and is himself the incarnation of God’s love for our world. As followers of Jesus how do we represent God’s love for the world?

MESSAGE FROM FR SHAUN – HOLY WEEK

During Holy Week and Easter last year we were living under the first national lockdown and no public worship was permitted. This year another national lockdown will still be in operation during Holy Week and Easter, but there is one important difference. This year public worship is permitted and we will be able to gather, albeit in a restricted way, to celebrate the most important Christian festival of the year.

Just as at Christmas last year, we are obliged to follow strict social distancing and other COVID secure procedures. This will mean that it will be necessary to limit the number of places available and so online booking will be in place for all of our Holy Week and Easter Sunday celebrations. We plan to celebrate with the same number of liturgies across the three parishes as we would in a normal year:

Palm Sunday: Our Lady’s 10am and 6.00pm; St John Fisher 9.00am; St John the Evangelist 10.30am

Holy Thursday: Our Lady’s 8.00pm; St John Fisher 8.00pm

Good Friday Commemoration of the Lord’s Passion: 3.00pm in all three parishes


Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday): Our Lady’s 8.00pm; St John the Evangelist 8.00pm

Easter Sunday: Our Lady’s 8.30am and 11.00am; St John Fisher 9.00am; St John the Evangelist 10.30am.

Online booking for our Holy Week/Easter liturgies will open on the respective parish websites on Monday 15th March. You are encouraged to book early. All of the celebrations at Our Lady’s will be livestreamed.

The way in which we celebrate Holy Week this year will inevitably feel very different: no singing, no washing of feet, no altar of repose, no kissing of the cross and other differences too. Nevertheless, we should give thanks that this year we are able to gather to celebrate publicly the mystery of Our Lord’s Passion, Death and Resurrection. We shall do as fittingly and as worthily as the circumstances allow.

50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE OPENING OF ST JOHN THE EVANGELIST CHURCH, MILL END AND MAPLE CROSS

2021 marks the 50th anniversary of the opening of St John the Evangelist church in 1971. I am delighted to say that Cardinal Vincent Nichols will be coming to St John's to celebrate a special Mass of Thanksgiving on **Sunday 27th June 2021**. We can be hopeful that by that time the restrictions will have been eased enough for us to be able to celebrate the day in a fuller way than we can right now. But we will have to wait and see. As part of our celebration of this important anniversary year we are moving forward with our plans to create a Lady Chapel in the side chapel area of the church. The statue of Our Lady from the church has now been removed in preparation for the construction of a new painted reredos which will form a new backdrop for the statue in its new space in the Lady Chapel. The old wooden altar, which has been unused since the church was re-ordered, is being refurbished as the Lady Chapel altar, and will sit beneath the statue and the reredos. We hope that this work will be completed in time for our big celebration in June.
