### 11<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) - 13<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2021

#### SUNDAY THOUGHT

Parables are a genre that seem to be relegated to the gospels; not many people speak in parables today. But for Jesus, this was a routine way of teaching. Jesus's parables have many meanings and people have differing interpretations of them. Some parables in Mark's gospel are enigmatic and we don't find them in any other gospel and, frankly we don't know exactly what Jesus may have meant. The first parable in today's gospel falls into that latter category. The seed growing secretly has been interpreted in a variety of ways. Neither Matthew nor Luke reproduces it in their gospels.

In some ways we are familiar with the gospel image of seed being scattered, such as parable of the sower and the seed, but today's parable tells a different story. God's kingdom is likened to a man scattering seed upon the ground, and the seed grows without the man knowing how. But when the grain is ripe, the man comes to harvest it.

The parable of the mustard seed, which follows immediately, is more familiar to us. Here too God's kingdom is likened to something, but in this case a mustard seed. The parable refers to it as the smallest of all seeds, but it produces the greatest of all shrubs. Perhaps the meaning of this parable is more self-evident than that which preceded it. In any case, neither parable is explained.

We are told that Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables, but that he explained them to his disciples privately. We might wonder why Jesus would not explain the parable to the crowds. Our somewhat disturbing answer can be found earlier in the same chapter when Jesus says 'they may look and see but not perceive, and hear and listen but not understand, in order that they may not be converted and be forgiven.' It may sound strange to us that Jesus would not want those on the outside to be converted and forgiven. But like other Markan passages, this tells us a great deal about the community for whom Mark wrote, and its sense of being persecuted. The disciples whom Jesus called formed bonds stronger than family. They were chosen to live in relationship with him and one another. Though he taught in enigmatic parables, he explained all to his disciples. Those on the outside understood the words, but not the hidden meaning of the parables.

There is a sense in which we have domesticated Jesus to such a point that sometimes his message, what it meant at the time, is lost to nice explanations and tidy clarifications. But truthfully, Jesus was someone who spoke in riddle-like speech we call parables. Perhaps he did not want his meaning to be grasped by larger audiences. Or perhaps that is merely a reflection of the Markan community that preserved some of these parables. In any case, these enigmatic sayings that Mark preserved needed a solution. They needed to be explained or simply dropped from the story. There are examples of each of these two kinds of solutions in Matthew and Luke. Though it can be difficult, it might not be bad to recognise that Jesus was perceived by some as eccentric. Such an image can challenge the image of Jesus we are so familiar with.

Let's allow Jesus to speak with his own voice in the Scriptures, without wrapping up all the loose ends. His words have power and meaning, especially to a believing audience. Once that power is unleashed it becomes life-giving. But if it remains domesticated it loses its potential efficacy.

### REGISTRATION FOR FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2022

Registration of children wishing to make their First Holy Communion in 2022 will take place in July 2021. To be eligible children must be in Year 3 or above by September 2021 and attend Mass regularly in one of the three parishes. The expectation is that all children preparing for Holy Communion should already know how to make the sign of the cross and know the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be. These prayers should be taught and prayed in the home regularly. Parents may bring their child for registration on the following dates:

**Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July – St John Fisher – 7.00pm to 8.00pm**

**Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> July – St John the Evangelist Parish Centre – 3.15pm to 4.15pm**

**Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> July – Our Lady Help of Christians Parish Hall – 7.00pm to 8.00pm**

It is essential that you bring with you to the meeting the child wishing to be prepared for Holy Communion. If your child was baptised somewhere other than Our Lady Help of Christians, Rickmansworth; St John Fisher, Chorleywood or St John the Evangelist, Mill End you will need to bring with you the child's baptismal certificate. You are welcome to bring your child to whichever of the registration times is best for you. There is no need to make a particular appointment, please just come along during the appointed times. Do not worry if the place of registration is not your usual church for Sunday Mass attendance.

### UPDATED - IMPORTANT INFORMATION - MASS ATTENDANCE STICKERS AND CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE (CCP) OF 2022 SECONDARY TRANSFER AND NURSERY / RECEPTION 2022

With the Sunday Mass Obligation currently suspended and the ability of families to attend Mass in the parish each Sunday being very restricted due to social distancing measures, it is currently not possible to provide Mass attendance cards and stickers to families with a child making secondary transfer in 2022 or seeking a nursery or reception place in a catholic primary school in 2022. There currently seems to be a level of uncertainty about if, and on what criteria, priests are going to be asked to complete CCPs for 2022 admissions. For the time being, all parents with a child who will be seeking a place in a Catholic Secondary school in 2022 or a nursery or reception place in a Catholic primary school (other than St John's, Mill End or St Anthony's, Watford which do not require a CCP) should email me at [shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk](mailto:shaunchurch@rcdow.org.uk), providing the following information: *Name of the child (first name and surname); Parents/Guardians names (first name and surname); Address at which you reside; Telephone contact details.*

I will retain this information and keep a careful eye on Diocesan guidance with regard to the issuing of CCPs for 2022 admissions in the light of the prevailing restrictions caused by the pandemic. *Fr Shaun*

This year marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of the St John's Church on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> June 1971.
