EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) - 1ST AUGUST 2021

SUNDAY THOUGHT

Sourdough, pumpernickel, rye, whole wheat, ancient grain, pitta, white, and many more are the breads from which we can choose in our modern, convenient supermarkets. Variety and selection are the hallmarks of our society. It's sometimes easy to forget how basic bread was to an ancient culture. It certainly wasn't a speciality item that afforded choice and distinction. Bread was the staple of life, consumed daily as an essential source of nutrition.

The day after the 'multiplication of the loaves' the people were still seeking Jesus and found him in Capernaum. He admonishes them to seek not perishable food but the food of everlasting life. They only need to believe in him. The people, having just witnessed the sign of the multiplication of loaves the day before, wonder what further sign Jesus might give them. Irony, which is a hallmark of John's gospel, should not be lost.

The people demand a sign similar to Moses providing manna in the desert. At that time the Hebrew people had left Egypt and were wandering in the desert. They were fed by bread from heaven that appeared each morning. Jesus in turn reminds them that it was not Moses, but the Father who gives 'true bread' from heaven. Jesus' addition of the word 'true' is significant. In a double entendre, Jesus says that the true bread 'comes down from heaven and gives life to the world'. This sets the stage for his claim at the end conclusion of the reading, that Jesus himself is the Bread of Life.

Throughout the Gospel of John, Jesus is portrayed as the one who comes down from heaven. He is the one who gives life. This is a remarkable teaching for Jesus refers to himself as having come down from heaven. Essentially, this is a teaching reflecting the prologue of John's gospel, 'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God' and 'the Word became flesh'. No other gospel makes such a claim. Johannine theology is Christology. The true bread from heaven that gives eternal life is none other than Jesus himself the Word of God made flesh.

As we reflect on the mystery of the incarnation, the coming down from heaven to live among us, the bread of everlasting life, we can ask ourselves: How are our lives different because of this belief?

COVID-19 ROUTE MAP: STEP 4 GUIDANCE

GENERAL

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has issued specific guidance to help parishes with the implementation of Step 4 of the Covid 19 Route Map, which came into effect on Monday 19th July. The key points with regard to the celebration of Masses are as follows:

- There will be no legislation on social distancing in England and churches may thus increase their capacity. Each local community is to examine the local conditions regarding the virus and adopt an attitude of care for those who desire to attend Mass.
- The wearing of face coverings is **strongly recommended** to be worn by those in church.
- Indoor congregational singing will be permitted and face coverings should be worn by members of the congregation whilst singing together, until infection levels reduce.
- Holy water stoops will not be refilled at this time.
- There will be a retiring offertory collection at the Sunday Masses.
- It is recommended that the physical Sign of Peace remain suspended.
- Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind.
- The livestreaming of Masses from Our Lady's will continue.

With regard to the Sunday Obligation the Bishops have said: "It is hoped that it will be possible for all Catholics in England and Wales to fulfil this most important Church precept,...,by the First Sunday in Advent 2021. In the meantime, all Catholics are asked to do their best to participate in the celebration of the weekly Sunday Mass and to reflect deeply on the centrality of Sunday worship in the life of the Church."

SPECIFIC IMPLEMENTATION OF STEP 4 ACROSS OUR THREE PARISHES

Sunday Masses during August

We will maintain the current Sunday Mass schedule (though now without social distancing measures) until September 2021. The reasons for maintaining the current Mass schedule are:

- 1. Many people will be on holiday in during August and so numbers at Mass will naturally be reduced.
- 2. Many people may not immediately return to Sunday worship at Mass, following the lifting of restrictions.
- 3. Fr Damian will be on his own during August and would have to prepare for all of these Masses, even if he is not celebrating them. This is also at a time when there are many weddings and baptisms for him to prepare and conduct, increased hospital chaplaincy rota work, as well as possible funerals.

There is no longer any need to book places for Sunday Mass. The Sunday Mass schedule will be reviewed from when Fr Andrew begins his ministry as Parish Priest in early September 2021.

Face Coverings – Whilst it is no longer mandatory that face coverings be worn in church it remains **strongly** recommended that face coverings be worn in our churches. Please remember that wearing a face covering helps to protect other people! <u>Wearing a face covering in church should be seen as an act of charity to our brothers and</u> <u>sisters.</u>

Distribution of Holy Communion – The distribution of Holy Communion has returned to its normal place within Mass.

Singing in Church – Congregational singing in church is now permitted once again (though face coverings should be worn). Hymn books will not be made available during August. This will be reviewed in September. During August there may be the possibility of singing some well-known hymns/parts of the Mass from memory.

Weekday Masses during August

There is now public weekday celebrations of Mass at Our Lady's at 9.30am Monday to Saturday. No booking is necessary.

Our Lady's open for private prayer – Our Lady's is now open for private prayer Monday to Saturday from 8.30am to 4.00pm, except for Wednesday during August and when the church is open for Mass.

Weekday Masses from September

As with other parts of society, the pandemic has challenged us to look at the ways in which we do things in the parishes. Bishops and priests of the diocese have discussed that not everything can or should go back to how it was before the pandemic. This is true for the weekday Masses across the three parishes. Before the pandemic, the numbers attending weekday Masses at Chorleywood and Mill End were very low – often as few as four to six people. The aftermath of the pandemic is likely to reinforce this trend in low weekday Mass attendance. Consequently, after consultation with the Senior Leadership Team, it has been decided to not reinstate the Wednesday Mass at Mill End and the Friday Mass at Chorleywood. However, from September 2021, Mill End will have a Monday 9.30am Mass and Chorleywood will have a Tuesday 9.30am Mass. A 9.30am Mass on Wednesday will be celebrated at Rickmansworth, where numbers attending weekday Mass are significantly larger.

COVID-19 ROUTE MAP: STEP 4 GUIDANCE

Stewards and Cleaners

With the lifting of restrictions the requirement for stewarding and special cleaning of churches is removed. During August, as we transition back to a more normal pattern, we plan to maintain one steward at each Mass. We will gradually phase back to our teams of Welcomers in each parish. If anyone who has been serving as a steward would be willing to join our Welcoming teams, please contact the person who has been coordinating the stewarding rota for your parish.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks and gratitude to all the parishioners who have so generously served across the three parishes as stewards and cleaners. Without their generosity and willingness to help we would not have been able to re-open our churches for public worship. Our three parish communities are deeply indebted to them!
