THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) - 24TH OCTOBER 2021

Our Synodal Journey begins

In October 2023 the bishops of the Church will come together in Synod. The path toward this Synod, 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission', is a worldwide invitation to all the faithful. Pope Francis writes:

'Every synodal process, in which the Bishops are called to discern what the Spirit is saying to the Church, not by themselves but by listening to the People of God, is an evident form of that "journeying together" which makes the Church grow.' (Synod Preparatory Document 14)

This call to the synodal journey takes place in a period of global pandemic. Some parts of the world appear to be emerging from it, while other parts of the world are still suffering its full effects. The pandemic has exacerbated already existing inequalities in the world. 'At the same time, this global crisis has revived our sense that we are all in the same boat, and that "one person's problems are the problems of all"'.

The Synod calls us, as urged by the Second Vatican Council, to 'scrutinise the signs of the times and interpret them in the light of the Gospel' (Lumen Gentium 4). It should, therefore, cause us to reflect on what we have learnt and experienced in the life of the Church during this time, and to reflect too on the anxieties and fears it has evoked within us.

This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through her experience which processes can help her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open herself to mission.

'Our "journeying together" is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God.' (SPD, 1) So here are the intertwined elements of a synodal Church, that which the title of the Synod proposes: communion, participation and mission.

We will have some moments of reflection on the questions of the Synod in some of our existing forums and groups but primarily in our three parishes we will come together for this period of listening and reflection on **Sunday 21st November** at the following times:

Our Lady's Hall, Rickmansworth 9.30-10.30am

St John Fisher Church, Chorleywood 10-11am

St John the Evangelist Parish Centre, Mill End 11.30am-12.30pm.

We would encourage all parishioners to try and attend one of these sessions answering this important call to reflection after what has been a difficult couple of years for so many of us. It is only by spending this time listening and reflecting together, that we as a Church will learn to grow stronger together and live out our calling as missionary disciples.

VIRGIN MONEY GIVING - Important news about giving online

You may have already heard that Virgin Money Giving - the online donation platform used throughout the diocese - is to close in November 2021. While the diocese is working towards alternative online donation systems, we thought it wise to make everyone aware of what this situation means for the parishes.

What does this mean for you?

During the pandemic online giving has become increasingly important for many parishes. We are fortunate to receive many one-off donations online. Some people have also generously set up recurring monthly donations via Virgin Money Giving to support the parish during COVID-19. From 30th November these monthly donations will be cancelled automatically by Virgin Money Giving. If you are someone who makes an occasional or regular donation online, you may now be wondering how you can continue supporting the parish. We will be setting up new online giving tools but this will take a little time to arrange. But before we get to that point, it is worth remembering that the best way to support the parish is by standing order.

Giving by Standing Order

Regular giving is the financial bedrock of the parish. It also costs the parish less to manage than online giving so your money goes further. If you would like to support the parish we would ask you to consider setting up a regular donation in this way. COVID PRECAUTIONS

Following a meeting of the COVID task force, seating in the Church has been returned to the pre-pandemic set up, and the one-way system removed.
