## TWENTY EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) - 10<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2021

### ‘I was in prison and you visited me...’

Prisons Sunday – the second Sunday in October – marks the beginning of the Week of Prayer for Prisoners and their Families, running through until the following Saturday. This mission began in England and Wales in 1975. It had its beginnings as a Roman Catholic initiative started by Bishop Victor Guazzelli, Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster, but quickly gained ecumenical support and became an ecumenical observance, receiving the patronage of: The Archbishop of Canterbury, the Archbishop of Westminster, the Archbishop of Wales and the Moderator of the Free Churches Group.

For more than forty years Prisons Week has encouraged the Christian community, through individuals and churches, to pray for the needs of all those affected by prisons: prisoners and their families, victims of crime and their communities, those working in the criminal justice system and the many people who are involved in caring for those affected by crime on the inside and outside of our prisons.

Prisons Week raises awareness and generates prayer. It motivates volunteers to step forward and give their time and gifts, in prisons and in their own communities. It provides an annual focus and reason for Christians to work together, building capacity and motivation to make a difference for people who are out of sight and often out of mind.

We invite you to pray the Prisons Week Prayer throughout the coming week:

Lord, you offer freedom to all people.  
We pray for those in prison.  
Break the bonds of fear and isolation that exist.  
Support with your love prisoners and their families and friends,  
prison staff and all who care.  
Heal those who have been wounded by the activities  
of others, especially the victims of crime.  
Help us to forgive one another.  
To act justly, love mercy and walk humbly together with Christ  
in His strength and in His Spirit, now and every day. Amen.

### COVID PRECAUTIONS

Following a meeting of the COVID task force, seating in the Church has been returned to the pre-pandemic set up, and the one-way system removed. Hymn books have also been distributed as we welcome the return of the choir and congregational singing. However, we would request that Parishioners continue sanitising their hands on entering the Church and wear a mask throughout Mass. Good ventilation continues to be a key safeguard against the spread of the virus and so the front and side doors will remain open throughout. However, recognising that we are now in autumn and temperatures are dropping, the back door in the main Church will be closed just as Mass commences should the weather and temperature in the Church require it. We also recognise that parishioners will have differing thoughts with regard to what they feel is a comfortable social distance to maintain between households and will provide notices that enable someone to request that the seat directly next to them is kept free. While it isn't appropriate to remove all restrictions at this time, we hope this is seen as a welcome step along that road
