# TWENTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 3<sup>RD</sup> SEPTEMBER 2023

## The Church: the Light of the Nations

In the first part of our Vatican 2 series we look at the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, Lumen Gentium.

One of the most influential documents produced by the Council is "Lumen Gentium" which translates to "Light of the Nations." This document, with its profound insights and perspectives on the nature of the Church, continues to shape the modern understanding of Catholic ecclesiology to guide the Church and the faithful even today.

Chapter one is entitled "The Mystery of the Church" and illustrates how at the heart of "Lumen Gentium" is a profound understanding of the Church as a "mystery." The document emphasizes the Church's divine origin and nature, rooted in the Holy Trinity. The Church is described as the "People of God," a term that highlights the participation of all believers in the priesthood of Christ. This concept affirms the fundamental equality of all members of the Church and underscores their shared responsibility for the Church's mission. "Lumen Gentium", also puts an emphasis on the nature and mission of the Church. The document seeks to express the Church's identity as the People of God, highlighting the unity and diversity within this community. It presents a shift from the more hierarchical model of the Church as an institution to a more inclusive vision, one that acknowledges the shared responsibility of all believers in the Church's mission. This emphasis on the People of God underscores the Church's essential nature as communal, rather than solely a clerical or hierarchical structure. "Lumen Gentium" underscores the Church's mission to proclaim the Gospel and bring salvation to all people. The document underlines the importance of evangelization, calling all members of the Church to share in this mission. The Church is seen as both a recipient and a communicator of divine truth, charged with spreading the message of Christ's love and salvation to the ends of the earth. (LG 1-8)

The second chapter 'The people of God' begins with an explanation of the communal nature of God's call to, and work of, holiness and salvation; specifically, how God chooses to sanctify and save us as a "people." We read that "God ... does not make men holy and save them merely as individuals, without bond or link between one another. Rather, has it pleased him to bring men together as one people, a people who acknowledges him in truth and serves him in holiness". Section 13 of the document addresses one of the single most misunderstood and controversial dogmas of the Church: "Outside the Church, there is no salvation". The document reaffirms that "the Church, now sojourning on earth as an exile, is necessary for salvation. Christ, present to us in his body which is the Church, is the one Mediator and the unique way of salvation. In explicit terms, he himself affirmed the necessity of faith and baptism and thereby affirmed also the necessity of the Church. In fact, through baptism, as through a door, men enter the Church. Whosoever, therefore, knowing that the Catholic Church was made necessary by Christ, would refuse to enter or to remain in it, could not be saved" (LG 14). From what has been stated, the Council is clear that it is precisely through membership in Christ's Mystical Body that the "divinization" of human nature is made possible. Salvation simply cannot take place outside of Christ, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Thus, if any person of any faith tradition, receives from God the tremendous grace of eternal salvation at the pivotal moment of death, it will necessarily have been through, with and in Christ and his Mystical Body the Church, which cannot be separated from Christ, her head; regardless of the theological beliefs of individuals throughout the course of their earthly existence.

Another significant aspect of "Lumen Gentium" is its treatment of the relationship between the Church and other Christian communities, as well as non-Christian religions. The document acknowledges the presence of elements of truth and sanctification in other faith traditions and recognizes the possibility of salvation beyond the visible boundaries of the Church. This ecumenical perspective marked a departure from the more juridical stance that had been prevalent in Catholic thought for centuries. "Lumen Gentium" acknowledges the importance of fostering unity among Christians and promoting dialogue with other religions. This reflects the Council's desire to engage with the modern world and create bridges of understanding. (LG 15)

#### MARTIN ROONEY RIP

#### BLESSING OF SCHOOL BAGS

#### CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE

A Certificate of Catholic Practice is exactly what it says - it confirms, for the purposes of a Catholic school application, that families are practising Catholics, i.e. attend Mass every weekend. The school form states that families practice the faith and are known to the priest signing the form. If you do not attend Mass every weekend and are not known to Fr Andrew, he is unfortunately unable to sign the form. If you have recently moved into the area, your previous parish priest can provide certification. If you require a CCP to be signed by Fr Andrew, in the first instance, please see him after Mass.

#### PARENTS AND TODDLERS GROUP

Working with St Peter's C of E Church in Mill End, we are looking to set up a parents and toddlers group together. This would be a weekly group based in Mill End. In order for this to begin, we need volunteers ready to lead the project. Is this something you could help with? Please contact the parish office if it is.

#### BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUP

One of the times that we need support the most is when we lose someone that is close to us. The journey to the funeral can be very busy organising things, and lots of people step forward to support the bereaved, but often, once the service is over, many feel isolated and alone. As a Christian community we should be offering more support to the bereaved, and so we would like to create a group whose main aim is to befriend those in the parish who are grieving, to journey with them, pray for them and support them. This would not be a professional counselling service, but those involved would receive training in journeying with those who are bereaved with compassion and care.
