TWENTY SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 1ST OCTOBER 2023

The Eucharist, Sacramentals & the Divine Office

In the second part of our Vatican II series we continue to look at the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium.

Chapter 2 of the document focuses on the Most Sacred Mystery of the Eucharist. It states that 'the Church earnestly desires that Christ's faithful, when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators. On the contrary they should take part in the sacred action, conscious of what they are doing, with devotion and full collaboration.' SC48

The document then decrees that the rite of the Mass be revised and simplified, with parts which over time were duplicated being omitted, and other parts that were lost, as accidents of history, being restored. There is an emphasis on opening up the treasures of the Bible and the amount of scripture read at Mass over time was expanded into a three year cycle. The homily was to be seen as an esteemed part of the liturgy and not an optional extra, and the prayers of the faithful were to be encouraged. It was also 'warmly recommended' that the faithful receive Communion at Mass, and under both kinds when the bishops 'think fit'. The document also emphasises the need for pastors to encourage the faithful to be present at both the liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, as they are two parts that form one single act of worship. The chapter finished by extending permission for the clergy to concelebrate at Mass, when not the main celebrant.

In Chapter 3 the Council sought to instruct the faithful on the other Sacraments and Sacramentals. It comments that the Sacraments confer grace, but also by the very act of celebrating them, the faithful are disposed to this grace to their profit, to worship God duly and to practise charity. Sacramentals are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the Sacraments, in that they signify effects, which are obtained through the Church's intercession, and they should point us to receive the Sacraments. However, the Council recognised that over time certain features in some rites of Sacraments and Sacramentals had rendered their nature and purpose far from clear to the people of today and so made some revisions. This included the introduction of the vernacular language, as to receive the sacraments and sacramentals in your own language 'can often be of very great help'. It also led to the restoration of the catechumenate for adults to give instruction to those receiving the Sacraments of initiation, and a revision of the rites of Baptism of infants, Confirmation, Penance, Ordination and Matrimony. It also emphasised that 'Extreme Unction' should more fittingly be called the 'Sacrament of the Sick' and should not only be for those who are at the point of death, but for anyone in danger of death from sickness or old age. Funeral rites were also to be revised to express more clearly the paschal character of Christian death.

In Chapter 4 of the document the Council reflected on the Divine Office, the prayer of the Church devised so that the whole course of the day and night is made holy by the praise of God. It encouraged both the clergy and faithful to pray the divine office, whilst taking into account the conditions of modern life in which those who are engaged in apostolic work must live. It encouraged the faithful to take steps to improve their understanding of the Bible, and in particular the Psalms so as to attune their minds with their voices in praying the Office. The Council also extended the time over which the Psalms would be prayed, from a one-week cycle to a four-week cycle, and a wider variety of scripture readings and a careful selection of works of the Church fathers, doctors and ecclesiastical writers be included. It also confirmed the duty of clerics in certain communities to pray the Divine Office in common, and of others to pray the entire office every day personally. It was also stated that the prayer should be said in the traditional Latin, but in individual cases the Ordinary could grant the use of the Vernacular recitation of the Office.
