THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 29TH OCTOBER 2023

Divine Inspiration and Interpretation

In the third part of our Vatican II series we finish looking at the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation, Dei Verbum.

The third chapter of the document reaffirms the central role of Sacred Scripture in the life of the Church. It states that the Bible is not merely a human product but is inspired by God. This inspiration ensures that the Scriptures are trustworthy and authoritative for matters of faith and morals. It affirms that those chosen to write down the words were inspired by the Holy Spirit who revealed what God desired to be written. None of the Scripture writers were robbed of human intelligence or knowledge, but in a special way their human characteristics, including their limitations, were used to deliver God's message faithfully without error. The document states that Scripture is without error in the sense that it is for our salvation, not in the sense of scientific or historical accuracy. Interpretation of Scripture comes from the Holy Spirit, too. Interpretation requires insight into historical analysis, literary analysis, understanding tradition, human sciences, and comprehending the purpose which the text served to its initial audience. Interpretation must be about faithfulness to true revelation if it is to bear the proper fruit. The Bible is a text inspired by God which is entrusted to the Church for the nurturing of faith and for one's life guidance (11-13).

In chapter four the document focuses on the Old Testament reminding us that Israel was chosen by God to establish a covenant of love with humankind. They were chosen to experience divine love and through this experience become an example for all nations. The Old Testament remains significant because it communicates how God remained active in the history of mankind and because it reveals the plan of God as to provide a definitive saviour; namely his only Son Jesus Christ. The Old Testament feeds us a wealth of prayers, insight into the teachings of God within a history of salvation. The mystery of salvation begins in the midst of the Old Testament, and so has enduring value up to its fulfilment in the God-Man Jesus Christ (14-16).

The document then moves on to reflect on the role of the New Testament noting that the Gospel writers told the story of Jesus in a way that the growing Church would understand and communicate as the truth of our salvation. In the New Testament salvation is completely achieved as through Christ's sacrifice he brings order into the world and establishes the reign of God on earth. Jesus reveals the Father as well as the Holy Spirit and completes God's plan. The four Gospels are the foremost teachings in Scripture. They contain the foundation of our faith. The Gospels provide the framework for the Church. They teach us how our lives are meant to be lived in conformity with Jesus Christ. In fact, the Gospels contain the story of salvation of every one of us and the truth about Jesus Christ (17-20).

The sixth chapter of the Constitution then moves onto reflecting on the role of Sacred Scripture in the life of the Church. It underscores the significance of the Word of God in the liturgical life of the Church. It encourages the faithful to engage with Scripture through the liturgy, and it promotes the practice of preaching that is firmly grounded in the Word of God. It is important to note that both the Eucharist and Scripture are celebrated in our Liturgy and Christ is delivered and consumed at the one table of God's Word and Body. The Word of God supports the Church and strengthens it and the true story of Theology rests in Scripture. We must come to know Scripture more and more, for, through Scripture we meet Christ. Ignorance of Scripture is to lack serious knowledge of Jesus and of who we are to become as the Word of God is truth that lasts forever.

The document states that everyone is to have access to the Word of God, as although it is possible for people to come to know God by contemplating the created world, with Scripture we can respond much more appropriately to God's call. Yes, revelation is complete in Jesus, but this does not mean we are not meant to experience God in our life. God is met in many dimensions of life, in the good and the bad, in the joy and in the suffering. True faith requires there be a response to Divine Revelation (21-26).
