The Word of God

In the third part of our Vatican II series we begin to look at the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation, *Dei Verbum*.

Dei Verbum, which translates as "The Word of God," is one of the pivotal documents produced during the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). This Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation seeks to address the role of divine revelation in the Catholic Church, emphasizing the importance of the Bible, Tradition, and the Magisterium. In this summary, we will explore the historical context, key themes, and lasting impact of Dei Verbum within the broader framework of Catholic theology and the development of modern biblical scholarship.

To understand the significance of Dei Verbum, we must first grasp the historical context in which it emerged. The mid-20th century was marked by a period of significant change and upheaval in the Catholic Church, as well as in the world at large. The Second Vatican Council, convened by Pope John XXIII in 1962, aimed to address the challenges and opportunities facing the Church in a rapidly changing world. One of the key issues facing the Church was the need to engage more directly with the modern world and modern scholarship. This included a re-evaluation of the Church's approach to the Bible and divine revelation. The historical-critical method of biblical interpretation had gained prominence in academic circles, challenging traditional views of scriptural inerrancy and interpretation. Dei Verbum represents a pivotal moment when the Church engaged with these challenges and opportunities, particularly in the realm of biblical scholarship and the understanding of divine revelation. This Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation continues to shape the way Catholics approach and engage with the Word of God, fostering a deeper appreciation of Scripture within the life of the Church and its relationship with the world.

The first chapter of Dei Verbum begins by emphasizing that God has chosen to reveal Himself to humanity out of love. Revelation is understood as God's selfdisclosure, an invitation to a loving relationship with humanity. This understanding of revelation is foundational to the document's approach. God wants us to know His love for us. Revelation is not just words about God; it is a living experience of God. God does not just reveal in words how best we should live, but God reveals himself as well. As revelation unfolds we become more aware of how God is ultimately over all things and God is complete in Himself. In coming to know more what God is like, we come to understand the purpose for our human existence. Besides in dying to save us, Jesus makes known our human connection to God. Jesus is both message and messenger. Jesus reveals that God has called us to Himself and promises that salvation will ultimately lead to be with him for eternal life. The Father sent the Son so he could tell us about the inner life of God. Jesus is not only the Word made flesh; he leads us to eternal life. Jesus is revelation in its completeness. There is no greater or necessary revelation than this. All things are made full in Jesus. The Holy Spirit was sent to bring us to completion. The Holy Spirit provides us with God's grace so that God's revelation may take root in us (2-6).
