TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 22ND OCTOBER 2023

Transmission of the Word

In the third part of our Vatican II series we continue to look at the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation, *Dei Verbum*.

The second chapter of this document begins by observing that in the very early Church, Christians preached and taught orally. They also sought to set an example by the way they lived. In time it became necessary to look for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to write down God's message. Therefore, God inspired with his Spirit the authors of the several books we find in the Bible in order to communicate his Word. Later on, the Apostles handed on the authority to teach and interpret the Word to the bishops who took their places.

Through the unending line of succession, the bishops are tasked with securing and protecting the Word of God and to see that it is kept intact to the end of time. The Word is the gift of faith, freely given by God, and faith develops through the Holy Spirit. Development of faith happens when we study, contemplate and put belief into action. This is why sacred Scripture and Church Tradition are closely connected and validly important to the growth of one's faith. Scripture is the Word of God and can be found in The Old Testament and the New Testament. Sacred Tradition is the Word of God passed on to us in various forms: Liturgy, prayers, and the teachings of the Apostles and their successors. The chapter ends by then looking at these two sources of Scripture and Sacred Tradition together, coming from the same origin (Christ), having the same goal (God) and working together (through the Holy Spirit) to help every person to move towards that goal. The document also reminds us that through their joint work God speaks to her bride the Church even now, so that she can unveil the mysteries which have not yet been unveiled and allow the Gospel to become a living voice for all the people of all times.

Hence, these two sources have a unity in their diversity. They are both the Word of God. Although, one is the very speech of God written by a human author under divine inspiration, the other is the living Church that from the Apostles onwards transmits, preserves, expounds and spread the same Word as it was handed to her. The Church does this through the authority which has been given to her from Christ himself (Mt 28), and therefore, by preaching, teaching, experiencing what she teaches, and by administering the sacraments. If God has chosen to speak to his Church in these forms, then, every Christian is called to pay the same homage and to hear from both sources. Otherwise, by listening to the Word with only one ear, one loses the possibility of knowing God as best as one is meant to.

The Constitution puts it in this way: "The Church does not draw her certainty about all revealed truths from the Holy Scripture alone. Hence, both Scripture and Tradition must be accepted and honoured with equal feelings of devotion and reverence". (9)

It seems that it was Pope Paul who suggested these words, and many of the Council fathers wanted such a statement to be included.

Having related the two main sources of Revelation, the Church makes a further effort to show that they are also related to the Magisterium. The document points out that the Magisterium is not above the Word of God but is at its service. The Magisterium has the task of keeping, expressing and communicating the deposit of faith. The bishops are the Church's official teachers. The word Magisterium means 'official teacher'. The bishops are charged with the duty to hand on the Word of God as it was handed on to them. The text of the Bible is sovereign in the Catholic Church.

Jesus came to reveal the truths and commission all of us to preach these truths. Some are ordained with authority to interpret and preach what they have read, come to believe, and put into practice. However, most believers communicate what they come to know through Scripture that is Jesus Christ, by the way they live it in their family and in the world. In fact, we all make up the Church and we all have a role to play in communicating God's Word (7-10).
