# **ENCOUNTERING JESUS, SERVING OTHERS**

#### TWENTY SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 8<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2023 **SENIOR LEADERSHIP** TEAM

The Liturgical Year, Sacred Music, Art & Furnishings

In the second part of our Vatican 2 series we conclude looking at the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium.

In the fifth chapter of this document the Church reflects on the celebration of the liturgy throughout the year. It tells us 'in the course of the year, [the Church] unfolds the whole mystery of Christ from the incarnation and nativity to the ascension, to Pentecost and the expectation of the blessed hope of the coming of the Lord'. SC102 Here the document talks of the importance of weekly celebrating the Lord's day in memory of the Resurrection, of celebrations of events in the life of Mary and of the annual feasts of martyrs and other saints. The Council also affirms the importance of celebrating pious practices in various seasons of the year by instruction, prayer and works of penance and mercy. The document decreed that the minds of the faithful should be directed primarily towards the feasts of the Lord, and so rather than celebrate all the feasts of saints over the course of the year, due preference should be given to hearing about the life of Christ and the mystery of salvation within the texts of the time of year. It also focused on the Lenten season giving greater emphasis on to baptism and penance, and to holding the paschal fast as sacred. The Council also commended the veneration of authentic relics and images of saints who offer to the faithful fitting examples to imitate.

The document moves onto reflecting on the musical tradition of the Church, calling it a 'treasure of inestimable value, greater than even that of any other art... as a combination of sacred music and words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy' SC112. It recognises that both in scripture and in the words of the Church Fathers, music has held a special place in the Liturgy and therefore 'the treasury of sacred music is to be preserved and cultivated with great care'. It encouraged that the faithful be taught relevant chant, with Gregorian chant being specially suited to the Roman liturgy, so that they would be able to 'contribute that active participation which is rightly theirs'. The Council decreed that great importance should be attached to the teaching and practice of music in seminaries, houses of studies and schools. There was also recognition of musical traditions of other lands, and their music was to be held in proper esteem and in a suitable place within the liturgy. The use of the pipe organ was particularly praised, but other instruments were permitted with the consent of the local authority and provided they were appropriate for sacred use. The chapter concluded by emphasising that all compositions for liturgy must always be in conformity with Catholic doctrine, and chiefly from sacred scripture and other liturgical sources.

The final chapter of this document reflects on Sacred Art and furnishings. It comments of their nature the arts are directed towards expressing in some way the infinite beauty of God in works made by human hands'. The Council emphasised that all 'things set apart from use in divine worship should be worthy, becoming and beautiful, signs and symbols of things supernatural' SC122. It talks of the importance of training artists to this end, and always ensuring a high standard of craft for use in our places of worship. The document decreed the importance of admitting styles from every period, but always favouring truly sacred art of noble beauty rather than sumptuous display. It also called for the continued practice of placing sacred images in churches for veneration by the faithful. Finally, the chapter talks of the need for careful consideration to be made to ensure worthy and well-planned construction of sacred buildings, particularly in line with the new norms of the reformed liturgy discussed earlier in the document.
