THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) - 12TH NOVEMBER 2023

The Role of the Church in the Modern World

We continue to look at the fourth part of our Vatican II series at the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, Gaudium et Spes.

The third chapter of Part One of the document is entitled 'Man's Activity in the Universe' and begins by observing that thanks to an increased understanding of science and technology, in recent years humanity has grown in it's questioning of things which were assumed to be part of the plan of God. It goes onto state that 'far from considering the conquests of man's genius and courage as opposed to God's power..., Christians ought to be convinced that the achievements of the human race are a sign of God's greatness and fulfilment of his mysterious design' (GeS34). Rather than disproving the existence of God, human discoveries are evidence of this, as without a creator there can be no creature. However, with human progress comes grave temptations, such as pride and inordinate self-love, and these must be purified and perfected by the cross and resurrection of Christ. The Word of God reveals to us that 'God is love' and at the same time teaches us that the fundamental law of human perfection and consequently transformation of the world is the new commandment of love. It is by this revelation that we know that the form of this world that is distorted by sin is passing away and we look forward to the new dwelling God is preparing for us. This expectation means that rather than diminishing our concern to develop this earth, we should be spurred on in spreading the fruits of our nature and our enterprise, of human dignity, brotherly communion, and freedom always aware that 'here on earth the kingdom is mysteriously present; when the Lord comes it will enter its perfection' (GeS39).

The Constitution continues with a chapter dedicated to the 'Role of the Church in the Modern World'. It tells us that proceeding from the love of the Father, the Church was founded on Christ and gathered into one in the Holy Spirit. It therefore has a saving and eschatological purpose which can only be attained in the next life, but here on earth it is called to unite the family of God and to increase it continually until the Lord comes. The Church is therefore entrusted with the task of revealing to humanity the mystery of God and in doing so open up the meaning of our own existence and the innermost truth about ourselves, satisfying the deepest cravings of the human heart. The Church also has the role of raising the dignity of human nature above all fluctuating opinions, upholding the rights of man in accordance with the spirit of the Gospel and preserved from false autonomy. This role extends beyond the individual to the whole of society, as the Church's mission is a religious one which can be the source of commitment, direction and vigour to establish and consolidate the community according to the law of God.

The Council warns against the danger of shirking our earthly responsibilities due to our knowledge that this is no lasting city, but also by immersing ourselves in the things of the earth and keeping religion separate as the fulfilment of a few acts of worship and moral obligations. It states 'one of the gravest errors of our times is the dichotomy between the faith which many profess and the practice of their daily lives... the Christian who shirks his temporal duties shirks his duties towards his neighbour, neglects God himself and endangers his eternal salvation' (GeS43). It encourages us to follow the example of Christ, living in the world but directing all things towards the glory of God.

The Council also recognises that the Church has much to receive from the modern world, particularly from its experts in its organisations and its forms of training, which can enrich both believers and unbelievers in coming to a better understanding of truth in the light of the Gospel.

The chapter concludes with the statement: 'Whether it aids the world or whether it benefits from it, the Church has but one sole purpose – that the kingdom of God may come and the salvation of the human race may be accomplished' (GeS45). This is why Christ came to us in the flesh, why he died and then rose again for us, and why with his Spirit we continue to move forward together towards the consummation of history which fully corresponds to his plan of love.
